From the Desk of Father Smith



With the Christmas Season in our rearview mirrors, but the lessons and graces of Christmas still in our hearts, we begin the liturgical season of Ordinary Time this week. Ordinary doesn't mean ordinary, as in usual/plain/boring, but a time that is measured and counted with ordinals (numbers). In Ordinary Time, we are literally counting the days. But we should also be



making the days count! How can we make each day count? We can enter in more deeply to the life of Christ through prayer and active participation in our worship, by reading the Bible and other spiritual works, by living lives of joy, kindness, and love of the poor! These are all ways that we can make our days count.

It is interesting that we begin Ordinary Time with a most extraordinary event from the Gospel of John. Our Gospel this week recounts the story of the Wedding Feast at Cana, where at the prompting of his mother, Mary, Jesus performs his first "sign" or miracle. The Gospel writer tells us that this sign was to "reveal his glory" and that "his disciples began to believe in him". What do signs such as these really mean to us? Do our eyes and minds and hearts take in the glory of Jesus through this sign? Do we believe more fully in Jesus as the Son of God and as our savior and brother because of this sign? Even if we say we believe, is our "believing" in Jesus simply an intellectual assent, or does it lead us to "belong" to God? Even the devil and his angels "believe" in God, but they have chosen not to "belong" to God. Mary tells the servers at the wedding, "Do whatever he [Jesus] tells you." So the bottom line question is, do we live our lives differently because we have seen his glory and believe in him? Do we make our days count because of our faith in Jesus Christ?

Faith Formation Update

Between the weather and various illnesses among catechists, we haven't gotten off to a great start in 2022, but we are hoping that we can get back on track this coming week. We were able to have First Reconciliation with our 2nd Graders, and they did a great job! Thank you to Msgr. Ed Lechtenberg for helping the young people and their families with the sacrament.

With that in mind, we would like to resume the scheduling for some of our liturgical ministries, such as Altar Servers, Ushers, and Giftbearers, and are welcoming new participants in all of our liturgical ministries. Some of these might look a little different than in the past, e.g., ushers not taking up a collection and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion not distributing the Precious Blood, but we are looking to restore/resume these ministries in our parishes. Please contact the office if you are interested in receiving training and being added to the schedule. We hope to have training during the month of February.
