

Dear Parishioners,

Congratulations to all our first communicants. This is a special day for them. Next weekend we will be celebrating confirmation with Bishop Daniel Saturday morning. I look forward to this special day as well. I will be on retreat this week (Mon.-Fri.) so I pray you will all have a good week in my absence. Fr. George will celebrate the normal daily Masses.

Next Friday (May 6th), is the ordination of those who will become permanent deacons. This will take place at the Cathedral in Duluth. Please pray for these men and their wives as they take this important step to serve the body of Christ. While we are on the topic of ordinations there will be 2 men ordained to the priesthood (Scott Padrnos was assigned here last summer and Dan Hammer) June 24th.

On a similar note, I am going to head to New Ulm for the final vows of the religious sisters (Handmaids of the Heart of Jesus) on Sat. June 25th. If anyone is interested in attending this event, maybe we could organize rides. It's at 10 AM that Saturday at the Cathedral in New Ulm. If any families with young ladies would like to attend this event, I think it would be very inspirational. It's about a 3-hour drive, so you might want to make it into a weekend event. I'll be driving down just for the day. We have a little time to consider if this is something you would like to attend. It would be good if you let me know if you are interested, so I could let the sisters know how many are coming.

Some people have been asking about when we might receive the precious blood again at Mass. There has been talk about this amongst the priests. I think the general consensus currently is to offer this in the near future on special occasions. I am trying to be on the same page as our neighboring parishes, but what I would consider for the near future, would be at Pentecost and Corpus Christi. I wasn't prepared to do it for first communion and Easter Vigil, but maybe next year. We will see where we are at.

The sign of peace has been another question people have asked about. Here is what I would say regarding the sign of peace. During the time when it has been on hiatus, we have an opportunity to do a little re-education of what the sign of peace is all about. What it is, and what it is not. Collectively, the priests have been discussing how best to reintroduce the sign of peace. We recognize some people want it to come back... but we want to do it together, and also help it to be done well. The sign of peace is a beautiful liturgical gesture which expresses our unity. This is expressed well in (Matthew 5:23-24) "If you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift."

The sign of peace is meant to be a gesture that signifies our harmony with one another. It is not meant to be a pause in the action of Mass where we attempt to catch up with those around us. At times or in some parishes, the sign of peace has lost its connection to the liturgical action and has become a distraction from what we are about to do. The proper place to visit with family and friends is before or after Mass outside the nave (the area of the Church with the pews). The tension in our parishes is that we don't have a lot of space to do that... especially in cold weather. Given all of that... what is the proper way to share the sign of peace with those around us. I would say our gesture should be appropriate to the relationship and the culture. Spouses might offer the true kiss of peace . Family members may be comfortable with a handshake or even a hug... in our culture the usual sign is a handshake. However, there are those who whether because of the pandemic, or because there have never preferred to touch other people's hands... might refrain all together. We shouldn't take offense at this. In the end, the sign of peace is meant to be a brief, gesture that prepares us to receive the Eucharist. It should not turn into a rowdy intermission. I will touch on this again at some point, but this is a little preview of my perspective.


