

Dear Parishioners,

I wish to congratulate all those who have received sacraments lately. Both our first communicants and those who have received confirmation. It's a beautiful thing to witness our young people receiving these sacraments.

I also want to highlight the grace it is to see people getting married from our parishes. It's been my experience in some of the places I've served that I don't often know the people who are getting married. Often because I hadn't been there all that long... but other times it is because the people haven't been practicing their faith all that much. I find that here, it is a very different experience. I see those getting married are striving to live their faith, and even though they aren't necessarily going to be living here anymore, they come to get married and then plan to continue practicing their faith. That is a beautiful gift for me to see as a priest.

Another vocational journey that I see some of our young men exploring is the priesthood. You probably know we have a seminarian who is studying for our diocese (Zavior Franck). We also have a young man who is going to be ordained to the transitional diaconate for the Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo (Phil Stokman). We also have two young men who are applying to join the seminary for this fall. I won't name them, because I don't know if they would like to make this public yet. We also have one gentleman who is interested in the permanent diaconate. This is great to see. I am very blessed to see these men responding and being willing to discern these vocational calls.

As I look at our parishes, I hope that someday there will be some religious sisters that come from our midst as well. I have a new and great respect for this vocation. I had the opportunity to experience the religious life while I was in Duluth. Religious Sisters are an important part of the complete church family. They bring a particular gift and presence that is unique and special. They live as Christ's Brides and reveal that life in many fruitful and powerful ways.

There are many different religious orders for both men and women. I hope that our young people will be open to this beautiful life. It is a supernatural call, because none of us grows up in a religious house of formation. We don't have an experience of that life and so it may seem strange, but it is for the benefit of the Church. I think when we see a return of active religious in our communities, we will see a healthier Church. The religious life gives something to the Church family that no other vocation can.

I guess what I am saying is, I am so grateful to see vocations being lived, and discerned in our midst. It is a really great sign that you as parishioners are living with an openness to God. Thank you to the parents, and grandparents who are living your lives as a witness for the next generation.

God calls us all to be faithful Christians... that's our first vocation, but then there is the way which he calls us to follow him that is particular to us, and sometimes that can be difficult to discern. Don't discount the possibility that God might be calling you to a way of serving the Church that you never imagined. I could never have guessed that God was calling me to be a priest, and yet, I have found it to be a profoundly beautiful life. As with every vocation there are struggles and challenges. I am faced with new obstacles to overcome all the time, but just like every person who follows Christ, the Lord gives us what we need to keep moving forward.

I want to thank all of you for how you have welcomed me back. It is good to be with you, and I hope I can stay a good long while. May God bless you all!
