

Dear Parishioners,

I hope you are well. With the bike trails being open and the fishing opener this weekend we should be in full swing summer mode. Graduation is coming up and many students are looking for summer jobs. We have one of our seminarians that is probably going to be coming to stay with me for a bit. Ben Sundlie is just joining the seminary, but will be doing Totus Tuus this summer. Currently, my understanding is that he will be staying with me for a few weeks before that all starts. So, just and FYI if you see a young man helping out for the next few weeks, that is probably who it is.

We have our final public meetings for the St. Joseph Capital Campaign being hosted on Wed. May 25th at 3 PM and 6 PM in the social hall. If you haven't come to a meeting yet, please come and receive your personal folder. At these meetings we will share about the project, and give information about how people can be involved. There is also a time for question and answer, which has been helpful. This will save us from making efforts to personally contact parishioners. For those who have already been at the meetings, we would ask you to send in your decisions so that we have the best information we have to make plans for the new Church. This campaign is focused on getting us a clear understanding of where we stand which will bring clarity to our next steps in the process of building a new church.

While I was home visiting this past weekend, I was talking to my mother about how things are going in my home parish (she is on staff there). She does a lot of work with funeral ministry. One of the things that came up was how people often choose to work with organizations like Cremation Society, rather then a Funeral Home. People think they are getting a deal because it is cheaper... but you clearly get what you pay for in this regard. We have a very helpful funeral home here in Crosby, and there are others in the area as well. I would strongly encourage people to make plans with a funeral home. They walk the family through the process and help everything go smoothly. They assist with lining up all the details that most people are unaware of. What you get with the Cremation Society type outfits is the ashes in a box. They don't give you the service you need in such times. And even if they do extra things, they don't do a good job walking people through the process and making it a sacred and memorable experience. I am only speaking from my experience and the experience of other priests, family and people that I have worked with. Don't let the price tag make the decision for you. Perhaps some of you remember I had been doing a class on preparing for death right before Covid (I know, it's Ironic). I think this is still an area of need, and I might try to resurrect that class sometime in the near future. As Catholics, we have a specific way we go through the death and dying process. There are many things that are culturally accepted that aren't Catholic practices. If you have questions about anything, it's good to talk to me or even a funeral home before you make decisions. It's also important to communicate your wishes to your children or relatives so that they know what to do when you are nearing death or have died. Sometimes I see a lot of stress and infighting in families because there wasn't any communication. A plan is always helpful to make things more clear. Estate planning, designating power of attorney, medical health directive, and wills are all things that can help that process go smoothly and allow the family to focus on the most important things.
