Dear Parishioners,

I pray you are having a good beginning to summer. This weekend we are celebrating a civil holiday as well as a sacred one. It is great that we take time as a culture to honor those who have served our nation. We honor those who are serving currently, but we especially take this weekend to honor those who have given their lives on our behalf. We should never take for granted the sacrifices which were made to give us our freedoms. By the blood of our forefathers our way of life has been protected numerous times. When others would have taken our freedom away, they offered their lives to defend our nation. Let us strive to honor the men and women who are serving us, and who have served us. One of the best ways we can honor them, is to use the freedoms they protected. When we use our freedom to make good decisions, to help others, to work towards a better society, we are honoring their sacrifice. I want to offer my sincere thanks and prayers for those who serve in our military.

We also celebrate the Ascension. This day we commemorate the event of Jesus ascending into heaven to the right hand of the Father. Often, we think of this event as the day when Jesus went away. He didn't leave us alone; he gave us the Holy Spirit. One of the important things about the Ascension, is that Jesus stands now at the right hand of the Father. He now intercedes for us, he helps us and through the Holy Spirit he remains present in the world. Therefore, today's celebration isn't just one of sending Jesus off. Rather, it's an opportunity for us to be in constant contact with Jesus. We are now able to plug into a conversation with Jesus whenever we want through prayer. He can be present to everyone and everywhere at once. A reminder that we will have some liturgical changes starting next weekend (see last week's bulletin). We will begin the sign of peace (some may prefer not to make physical contact, which is fine, please respect their choice). We will offer the precious blood for special feasts (Pentecost being one of them). At St. Joseph we will no longer use the communion kneelers. All these changes begin next weekend on Pentecost.

I also want to extend a special welcome to our summer guests. Thank for joining us. It's great to see so many people come to Mass during their summer visits to our area. I pray you have a great holiday weekend and get some needed R&R. It's great to be Catholic isn't it... what other Christian church can a member just plug in wherever they go and be part of the community no matter where they are or what language the liturgy is celebrated in! We are truly blessed to be part of the universal (Catholic) Church which Christ established. In this month of May we honor Mary, and so I would like to share the oldest known Marian Prayer we have which dates back the 3rd century. It's called the Sub Tuum or sometimes the Sub Tuum Praesidium (under your protection).

We fly to thy protection, O holy Mother of God. Despise not our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen.



St. Joan of Arc | May 30

St. Joan of Arc (1412 - 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against

the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiegne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen. St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members. © LPi


