

# Dear Parishioners,

Happy Solemnity of Pentecost! Today we renew our desire to live by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit connects us to Jesus. How do we live in the Spirit? There are some things we can do to be connected and open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. One is to live in the state of grace as much as possible. This is most easily done by going regularly to confession. However, it's important to understand that not sinning is helpful, but it isn't all that is needed to be living in the Holy Spirit.

We also need to have a life of prayer... we should do our best to be obedient to our superiors (this is especially important for priests and



religious). We ought to keep growing in our relationship with God. This is an on-going part of anyone's life who wishes to live by the guidance of the Holy Spirit. There can be challenges that occur at times with living by the Holy Spirit. One of the challenges is that people may have different ideas about what the "Holy Spirit" is telling them to do... this is especially problematic when people get the impression that they know what other people should do. Here are some things that can help us from falling into this difficulty.

1. Private revelations to individuals should never be given more importance or weight than Church teachings or proper church authority. Not only are these kinds of things extremely rare, but when they do happen, they always need to be tested and be approved by the Church. So, when someone says "Jesus or Mary or an angel told me you need to do... x". Right away, that is a red flag.

2. It's best therefore, to focus on our own discernment. What is the Holy Spirit asking ME to do? Asking the Holy Spirit to guide us doesn't mean we are going to hear a voice or see a vision of God telling us something... rather it usually comes down to asking the Holy Spirit to guide us through making us aware of his will through different signs, impressions etc. For example, we might be trying to decide whether to sell our home and move into a new one... We might ask God to make it clear what we should do. If the details of the situation dictate us going one way or another, we can understand this to be God showing us what to do. Our prayer is asking for clarity... we might even give some stipulations. (If they offer X amount of dollars for our current house, and we can find one for a certain amount and those criteria are met, this could be our sign).

3. If someone feels the Holy Spirit is telling them to do something which goes against church teaching, then you can be sure it's not from the Holy Spirit.

4. The Holy Spirit will always guide us towards deeper union with God. Therefore, to be truly connected to the Holy Spirit we need to take opportunities for God to speak to us. It is important to also note how the Spirit speaks. When the Holy Spirit speaks it's usually when we are peaceful, and usually the decision we are contemplating will fill us with peace if it's from the Holy Spirit. For more on this you can look at the discernment of Spirits by St. Ignatius of Loyola. A helpful book on this subject is "The Discernment of Spirits" by Fr. Timothy Gallagher. I hope you can experience life in the Spirit. I pray it's something you come to desire, and seek. Just a reminder that June 19th after the 10:30 Mass, we will have a Corpus Christi procession provided the weather cooperates. (continued on back)

I wanted to share a little update on priests in our diocese. You may or may not know about these priests but it does affect us because it will require Bishop Daniel to make decisions to meet our needs. Fr. Ryan Moravitz has been on leave for over a year, and has decided to leave active ministry. What that means is that he will no longer be serving as a priest. The details of his discernment are his to share... there may be some of you who know him, you can reach out to him. All that I know, is that this must have been a tough decision, and one not easily made. Fr. Keith Bertram who had been the pastor of Longville and Remer has taken a medical leave of absence. I'm not sure what the long-term assessment will be, but I am sure he can use our prayers as well. In his absence, I'm not sure what Bishop Daniel will do, I am sure he is working on trying to solve this challenge. This leaves us once again with more clusters in our diocese then pastors to cover them. We also have another cluster that is dealing with the same problem, and 2 parish assignments that usually have associates that do not. So, we are pretty stretched right now. So, I guess, I would continue to ask your prayers for myself and my brother priests to stay healthy and keep on the right path.
