Dear Parishioners,

I don't keep up on all the news, but I do have a few places where I look for news just to make sure I'm not missing anything. I've noticed that there have been a fair number of events lately where churchmen (that's bishops and priests) have failed to uphold the Catholic teachings on important matters. It is disheartening to say the least. June has been labeled "Pride" month, we see all kinds of ways in which this "Pride" agenda is being promoted and celebrated. To see our own clergy supporting these efforts, or allowing events or giving platforms for such propaganda to be preached is very disturbing. When we see our church representatives knowingly going astray and undermining Christ's teachings and the teachings of the Church which they are supposed to serve, what do we make of this? Unfortunately, it's not the first time this has happened. There have been times when the clergy have failed us in the past. If we look at the Arian crisis, the Protestant Reformation, the English Reformation, the time of the western schism... we see that it's nothing new for churchmen... even prominent members of the Church to fall into error... to teach error... or to go along with secular authorities when they fear to resist. All of these past events brought about great suffering, confusion, and loss of faith, and it is no different in our own time. When we see those who are supposed to safeguard the truth become complicit in the promotion of sin... heresy... or general confusion, it hurts the body of Christ. In all these past ages, God raised up saints to correct the problem within the Church. Men and women came forth to bring renewal. Some of these people had very little authority, but by their holy lives inspired change. We are certainly seeing a lack of consistency and a failure to remain faithful in the face of cultural pressure. Some people probably are asking where do these guys come from? Why did they become priests... why is God allowing this to happen? I don't have all the answers to those kinds of questions, but I know God allowed such things in the time of the Old Testament... many times Israel was led astray by her leaders. We also know that Jesus has promised that the Gates of Hell shall never prevail against the Church. That means the Church will overcome these wounds that are being inflicted. But not without suffering... sorrow and heartache. The Church will rise again, but at this time, we must strive to remain faithful. I might suggest that if you find you are scandalized by what you see members of the Church doing or saying... don't let that lead you away from Christ. We must hold to what Christ taught and listen to his authentic voice which is rooted in what has always been taught, and believed by the Church. The Church isn't going to change her teachings... and those who might try to do so in her name will cause confusion and may lead people astray, but they will also be held accountable for their actions. It is a fearful thing to lead others away from the truth... away from the Church and ultimately away from Jesus Christ. To some degree, we are all a product of our own experience and environment... but that can't excuse the real harm being done by these clergymen who are failing in their role as guardians of the Church and preachers of the gospel of Jesus Christ. I suspect that many of these clergymen were trained in a very confusing time after the 2nd Vatican Council. They have a different perspective, and they have been influenced by the culture. I don't think we can change their minds... but we can strive to remain faithful. It is a frustrating experience to be powerless to correct this problem, but let's not allow this to make us bitter or angry. Instead let's continue to prayerfully ask Jesus to bring renewal and to safeguard his Church.

I would remind you that we have Totus Tuus this week, (the youth program) so the Masses in Crosby will be Mon-Fri at 11:30 AM.
