#### Dear Parishioners,

I pray you will have a safe and blessed 4th of July. We celebrate our independence as a nation. It's a time when we can give thanks for the blessings we have received due to the sacrifices of others who believed in the cause of freedom and patriotism. There are some who are questioning whether we should be proud of our nation's history or ashamed of it. Undoubtedly there have been things which were done that were unjust and even evil. There is a long list of faults which we could point to, but we shouldn't allow that to keep us from celebrating and being proud of the good things which our country has done and stands for. I think our own experience and history of our Catholic faith can help us understand that when people are involved there is always going to be some problems and disfunction. Even though the Church is divinely instituted there are still individuals and groups of individuals who have failed to live up to what the Church truly stands for and strives to be. There are similarities with the American project. Just because there have been missteps along the way, doesn't mean we should get rid of the whole institution. There is a lot of revisionist history being done where we look back on our forefathers... on the founding fathers... and the major events of our history and judge them by today's standards. This can be an easy thing to do, because we come at things from our current understanding. But this idea that we need to pay restitution for the past is a problematic. It leads to blaming the past for our current decisions or faults. It proposes an impossible standard to live up to. I think we would be better served by trying to take responsibility for our own lives and our own generation. To do this well, we should study history and learn about the good and the bad of our past as a nation. It's okay to admit mistakes were made and to learn from them... but it's creating an unbearable burden if we think we need to take responsibility for things which we really didn't have any control over (meaning the past). We would be yoking ourselves to an unfixable problem... because there is no way for us to fix the past, only Jesus can do that. So, let's try to celebrate the good that our country stands for. We may not agree totally on

everything, but we can continue dialoguing and working together.

The over turning of the Roe vs. Wade decision brings to the fore tension within our nation that we will continue to deal with. As a Catholic I rejoice in this change of events. I pray it will save innocent lives...and I also hope it will spur dialogue about how we can support life in all it's stages. The issue of abortion has deeply divided our nation. It will continue to do so, but we have the opportunity now to



keep working it out in the public forum. I pray and hope that we will be able to reason through this together.


