



This Week's Reflection - February 7, 2021

"Is not man's life on earth a drudgery? Are not his days those of a hireling?" (Job 7:1)

Dear St. Francis Xavier Parish Family,

It appears that losses, sufferings and anxieties had haunted humans all the time. Thanks to (Mr.) Job who lived about 2,500 years ago, who helps us expressing this lament without blaming anyone, (even God or Satan), and without falling into despair.

"Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." (Mark 1: 38) Declaring the purpose for his presence among people, Jesus was pre-occupied, even obsessed, with maximizing the possibility of every person who has ears to hear the good news of the reign of God. He did this by preaching with authority. His preaching was always accompanied by acts of healing the sick, protecting the weak, feeding the needy, and exorcising demons.

After his baptism by John the Baptist at the Jordan River in Judea, Jesus began to appear in public. On the Second and Third Sunday in Ordinary Time we hear of Jesus recruiting his first disciples (Peter, Andrew, John and James) while announcing that *"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel"* (Mark 1: 15). Last Sunday we heard him going into a synagogue in Capernaum to pray and preach, and performed his first miracle, expelling an unclean spirit out of a man. Today's gospel gives us a glimpse into a twenty-four hour day of Jesus' life. He visited people who would welcome him into their homes, healing the sick so that they could carry out their daily routines of a normal life, healed various diseases of anyone who came to him, and kept expelling demons. He began his day with prayers.

With the losses of children and wealth, and the sufferings that he bore how would Job interpret Jesus' message of the good news of the kingdom of God? How would he revise his lament if he were to live in our time? One person we know did subscribe to this good news, St. Paul of Tarsus. *"All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it."* (1 Corinthians 9:23). Would we with confidence?



2020 CONTRIBUTION STATEMENTS

were mailed to you the week of February 1st. Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic they will not be available to pick-up in Gaspar Hall this year.

SFX PARISH HISTORY

In 1949, less than two and one-half years after Father Wartinger’s arrival, the sisters moved into their new home—a place that must have looked to them like a palace. The red brick, two-story (and a basement) building bore a cross above the west entrance while plaques bearing the Lion of Juda — The Coat of Arms of the Sisters of the Precious Blood graced the entrance at the south. The first floor contained two large rooms, one of which became a chapel and the other a study room initially and later a living room. In addition, there were three small rooms on the main floor; kitchen, dining room and office. The second floor included ten small bedrooms and two baths. The basement provided space for the laundry room, furnace room, storage area, and as Kim Younger Fitzpatrick recalls— a recreational area for some roller-skating sisters. When the sisters moved, they took along only their personal belongings. After they had settled in, the old furniture was disposed of, and the old building was torn down. (Continued on pg. 4)

PARISH HISTORY (continued from page 3)

On Palm Sunday, 1954, as Fr. Wartinger was concluding his sermon, he became ill. He was helped from the sanctuary by men of the congregation and taken to a hospital where it was found that he had a stroke. He was unable to return to the parish. Rev. Robert Baird, CPP.S., who had been the assistant pastor at the time of Fr. Meagher's death, was assigned to the parish as pastor. Fr. Baird assumed his duties on October 8, 1954. Although Fr. Baird had a successful and busy pastorate, he is especially remembered as a naval man. During WWII Fr. Baird had served as a chaplain. During his tenure at St. Francis Xavier, he prolonged his naval career through participation in the local Naval Reserve. Not surprisingly, these experiences were reflected in Fr. Baird's pastoral style. "He ran a tight ship," was Fr. Homsey's observation, and Fr. Homsey observed also that Fr. Baird's military training made it natural for him to delegate responsibilities and tasks. Harold Slater noticed a more humorous result of Fr. Baird's experience: He referred to the floor of the church as the "deck".





EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**The Audacity of Holiness**

Do you know a holy person? I'm not talking about piety — that's important, too, in its own way. But right now, I'm speaking of holiness.

St. Therese of Lisieux called holiness “a disposition of the heart that makes us humble and little in the arms of God, aware of our weakness, and confident — in the most audacious way — in His Fatherly goodness.”

The holy person sees a storm on the horizon of life, and rather than give themselves over to fear and despair (natural and understandable reactions), regards the gathering winds as an opportunity to rely more fully on God. The holy person takes a bad situation and sanctifies it with charity and understanding that defies our fallen human nature.

Peter's mother-in-law was still in the throes of a fever when Jesus grasped her hand. It wasn't until she took his hand and allowed him to help her up that “the fever left her, and she waited on them.” Before the fever could leave her, she had to commit to holiness — to put her trust in him in a most audacious way. She had to find it within herself to lift her weakened hand to grasp his — and as soon as she did, she was rewarded. Her bodily health restored, she gave thanks, and attended to his needs.

God's hand is always outstretched to us. Will we take it, even if the fever of sin and pride and worldly concerns rages in our souls? Will we muster the strength? Will we be audacious enough to have confidence in His Fatherly goodness? — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

Too Sick for Mass?
