This Week's Reflection - February 28, 2021

"God put Abraham to the test. ... Abraham named the site Yahweh-yireh; hence people now say, 'On the mountain the LORD will see.'" (Genesis 22: 1; 14)

Dear St. Francis Xavier Parish Family,

When the 40 days of Lent are taken as 40 days of holistic therapy, we might be able to measure some changes in our physical, mental and spiritual conditions. Well, in what shape are we after 10 lenten days (counting from Ash Wednesday to today, the Second Sunday of Lent)? If a discernable change is not yet detected, perhaps, we are still in the process of making adjustments, schedules to be modified and some religious and non-religious activities of ordinary life to be added or omitted. Or, maybe we are not quite in the grooves, yet, needing more frequent checks on emotional, relational and spiritual pulse.

The first reading today reveals that on top of all other going-on things these days, such as pandemic and weather related issues, Lent throws us into a time of intensive struggles. We are struggling to maintain a reasonable balance amidst the monkey-wrenches flying towards us at any moment. We are struggling to satisfy other people's needs demanding our attention. We are struggling to redeem ourselves realizing our blemishes and short-falls. If asked "how I am doing with the new year resolutions made just over a month ago, or how are the Lenten resolutions made a short while ago changing me thus far," only a test can tell!

We can't help but at times wonder if our present struggles are God's way of testing our faith. Or, are they the instruments of exercise through which we strengthen our faith? The pericope of Jesus' transfiguration seems to suggest that the Jesus-model therapy - 40 days of desert // 40 days of Lenten disciplines, are effective tools helping us in a gradual holistic transformation leading to a transfiguration like that of Jesus'.

"If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8: 31B) For, when and where we offer sacrifices God sees to provide (cf. Genesis 22: 14).

Additionally, if you do not have any means of transportation to your appointment, we will try to assist you in making it to your scheduled appointment time.





EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP — RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**When Sacrifice Becomes Mundane**

It seems to happen every year, like clockwork: we drag a bit, as we enter into the second week of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we feel a bit like soldiers banging our shields, rushing into battle. "We're ready, God!" our hearts cry out. "Transform us through sacrifice? Your will be done!"

But by now, these Lenten resolutions are no longer novelties — they've joined the ranks of everyday inconveniences, which somehow are the hardest to bear. Because transformation, in real life, happens in inches, just as a battle is won slowly in the crash of one sword against another. It's not always a dramatic thing, to the naked eye. It's the perseverance in prayer despite weariness, or the continual denial of some pleasure even though there's that nagging voice in our minds saying: *go ahead, God doesn't really mind.*

It's a week when we all need a shock to the system — and wouldn't you know it, this Sunday God gives us a double-whammy of dramatic sacrificial scenes. We picture Abraham, who also cried "Ready!" when God called, never imagining what He would ask: the surrender of his long-awaited son. We see Christ himself transfigured, as God shows us what He is ready to give up for love of us.

We must remain committed, persevering daily in acknowledging that everything belongs to God. What we sacrifice, we simply give back to Him.

If God is for us, who can be against us? Can we still reply, "Ready!" when we hear the call of God?



WHY DO WE USE INCENSE AT MASS?

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today. Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "*Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering*" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).
