





examining and evaluating the councils or committees on which they are serving, are discovering that there is much attrition, or members aging, with no one seemingly wanting to replace them. This seems to be a situation many organizations are facing.

One of the committees, which has been part of the parish for about twenty-five years, has decided to change its approach: namely, the vocation committee. For many years a "vocation cross" has been provided on a weekly basis for individuals or families to take with them and pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. This seems to have run its course over the years. It is not that we no longer need to pray for vocations, but rather, the committee is asking and inviting more parishioners to participate.

Rather than just one cross being passed from family to family, a number of little pocket crosses have been ordered to be distributed, so many more families will have a reminder of a cross to pray for vocations. A prayer will be accompanying this small cross for people who do not feel comfortable with spontaneous prayers. Fr. Joe Miller, C.PP.S., had been a great proponent regarding vocation awareness, so each cross will be stamped with his favorite prayer: "God is good." These crosses and prayers will be available for people at the end of September to take home to place in a prominent place, or to carry on one's person as a reminder to pray for priesthood and religious vocations.

A special thanks to those who have so diligently served on the vocation committee: Mike Caruso, Willie Clark, Shari Edelman, Cathy Pankiewicz, Bob Whetsell. All of them have been very faithful in their responsibilities for so many years. Mike Caruso will continue to write prayers for the bulletin on a weekly basis, and Bob Whetsell will lead the rosary at the end of holy hour each First Friday, unless the children are leading it. First Friday is always a good time for parishioners to gather, not only for the rosary, but to take some time out of the day to come to church to pray for vocations during the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

Thanks to the vocation committee for reviewing and reevaluating their purpose and their call to be people of faith, and to be proactive by inviting all parishioners, who wish to participate, to get involved in this prayer opportunity with the symbol of the cross. There are many ways to grow the parish in faith, and the vocation committee members have been a good example of people working together to help others grow spiritually.


