
ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In the commercialized world Christmas ends abruptly on December 25th, immediately luring people into the next opportunity of consumerism, which centers around the New Year's Day festivities. In the Church calendar the Christmas season begins on Christmas Eve and is celebrated for three weeks after December 25th, ending on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Hopefully we can continue the celebration of Christmas, inviting Jesus to remain with and in us throughout the following year. The Advent season, which we just ended, prepares us for the coming of the anointed one.



There are a number of feasts the Church celebrates during the season of Christmas: Holy Family, Mary, the mother of the God, Epiphany, and the Baptism of the Lord. This Sunday, which this year happens to be the day after Christmas, is the feast of the Holy Family. This feast celebrates Jesus, Mary and Joseph as a family unit. This story, which most of us are familiar with, is about Jesus being left behind in the temple in Jerusalem. In this gospel passage of Luke in Cycle C of the Church year, we read about Jesus "sitting in the midst of teachers, listening to them and asking them questions." The gospel continues: "all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and answers." It does not sound like Mary and Joseph were too impressed because they had been worried about him for three days. After a while they probably settled down, and we read that Mary "his mother kept all these things in her heart."

Chronologically this story does not make any sense because we just celebrated the birth of Jesus yesterday and in today's gospel reading he is already twelve years old. It is important to remind ourselves that scripture does not present the life of Jesus in chronological order. The purpose of scripture is to connect our lives with the life of Jesus.

Back to the passage about Jesus in the temple. How does this passage connect us to grow in our life of faith? At the end of this gospel passage of Luke, chapter 2:52, we see written: "and Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man." This sentence gives credence to the fact that Jesus truly is both God and human. Jesus, born to us, grew in wisdom and age as many human beings do. This gospel passage also shares about Jesus' family life with Joseph and Mary, his parents. He lived his life as any family experienced during the time of Jesus. He was born to us, one like us.

The feast of the Holy Family should not only help us recognize Jesus in his humanness and his divinity, but his life also exemplifies the holiness we need to pursue personally and as a family. If we claim to follow the way of Christ then we need to be holy as he is holy. To become holy, personally or as a family unit, we too must grow in wisdom (knowing and living Jesus) and age (participating in the glory of God).


Dear Jesus, send us young priests on fire with love for your mother Mary; she will become our Mother who intercedes to deepen our love for you. Amen.
