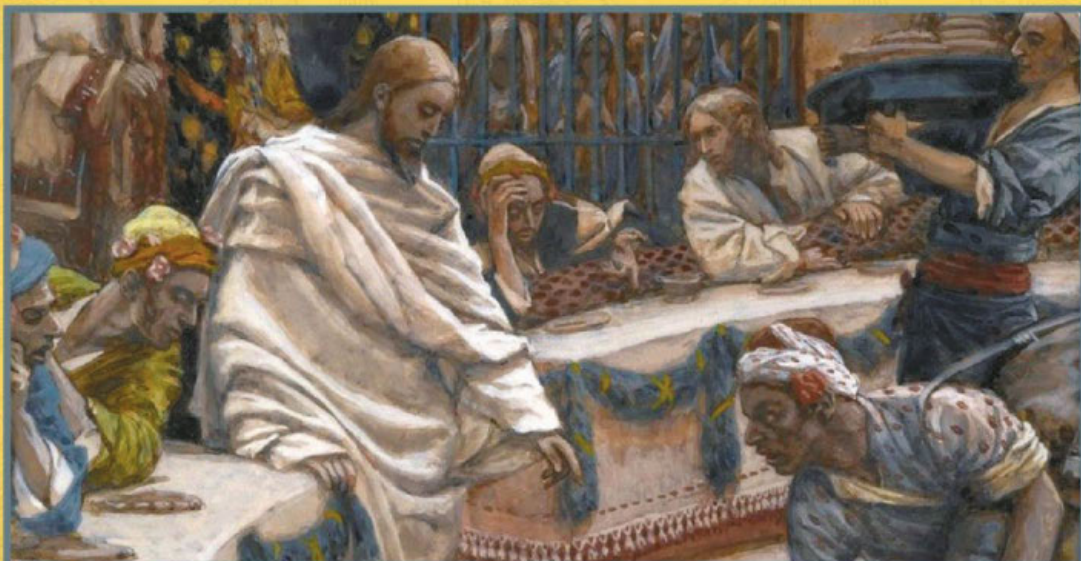

## Pastoral Reflection

2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time – January 16, 2022

*“To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.”*

(1 Corinthians 12:7)

Dear St. Francis Xavier Parish Family,

The Ordinary Time is the longest liturgical season in our annual worship cycle. With the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus last Sunday we began the part 1 of the 2 parts of the Ordinary Time in the Church’s worship calendar. This first part of the Ordinary Time will pause after the 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday for the Season of Lent (March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2022); then the second part will resume after the Pentecost Sunday (June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022).

The gospel passages during the first part of cycle C Ordinary Time (John’s this Sunday and Luke’s for the rest of cycle C Ordinary Time Sundays) reveal the various activities of Jesus among people as he began his public ministry. Noticeable in these reported events are that Jesus was baptized to do ministry and that his actions always accompanied his words.

Time and space may be “ordinary” but each person among us is “special,” having been baptized in Christ and empowered to do ministry by our participation in being prophet, priest, and king with Christ. The Vocation Prayer of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood pleads:

*“O God, you created me for a purpose, a specific task for the Church and humanity. You have always known the work I was cut out for, a work which only I can do and no other. If I do not accept this work, it will never be done. Therefore, I have a job to do. Make clear to me your will, and I will follow you in whatever task this may be. I know I can do all things in you, my strength. Amen.”*

The voice from heaven declared over Jesus’ baptism, *“You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.”* (Luke 3: 22) Commissioned through baptism to carry out our specific task, and armed by the manifestation of the Spirit, may each one of us delve into the present ordinariness of daily life believing, *“You are my beloved; with you I am well pleased.”*
