



Pastoral Reflection

I have not taken the opportunity to share much about St. Francis Xavier School. So with Catholic Schools' Week just around the corner, scheduled to begin on January 31, I thought this would be a good time to share about our own parish school. I have had the privilege to serve in a number of parishes, which have been responsible for a school connected to its parochial structure. The greatest gift to me was the diversity availed to me through these various experiences, from a Catholic mission on the Navajo Nation, to the inner city of Kansas City, to the outreaches of northern Wisconsin.



Two of the schools I served were not traditional Catholic schools since many of the students were not baptized Catholic. I grew in faith personally because of what all these students and parents offered me. I was impressed with many of the students or parents who were given the option to opt out of the traditional Catholic structure of prayers and Eucharist at the school, and in all cases they shared that these traditions were exactly what parents were wanting for their children. It was delightful to be in the classrooms where students longed to hear those Bible stories and hear about the heroes of the Church we call saints. Scripture, tradition and religion seemed to have come alive right before me.

Unfortunately I have not had a good opportunity to interact with our children and their parents here at St. Francis, due to COVID restrictions. I definitely want to respect the procedures in place, which seem to minimize possible outbreaks. I am looking forward to the time when we as pastors of the parish can again participate with the students' faith development through visits and open discussions. I have definitely appreciated the opportunity afforded to us when students participate at our weekday Masses.

We, at St. Francis are blessed with teachers and administrators, who are so committed and connected to the school. A number of them are products of the St. Francis Xavier faith-tradition itself. Sacrificing in their lives in so many ways, they want to continue to share this tradition with the young children of our community. Not only are they committed to the future because of their own history but a number of them have served in this school for many years. Thank you to our teachers and administration for sharing your gifts and lives with the people of our parish and of the local community. You truly are a blessing to the school and parish.

There is always the question whether we can continue to maintain our Catholic tradition in our parish and in our local community. It would be nice to have a crystal ball to give us all the answers regarding the future of Catholic schools. St. Francis School has survived a depression, overpopulation (if you can believe that), a building addition, shortage of staff, shortage of funds, and presently a virus. We trust that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide us into the future. We seem to have a local team of people who believe in Catholic education, assisting the Catholic community to hopefully design a plan to continue to develop and grow in our faith through Catholic education. I look at the here-and-now and realize we are blessed with wonderful people who are providing for this particular Catholic school we call St. Francis. Thank you so much for believing that what is happening now will make a difference for the future.

It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.


