


Pastoral Reflection

"The Lord called me from birth, from my mother's womb he gave me my name." (Isaiah 49: 1)

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated [sanctified] you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you." (Jeremiah 1: 5)

Dear St. Francis Xavier Parish Family,

During the week praying for the Unity of Christians we also pray to God for protection of human life (especially of the unborn, the aged and the vulnerable) and for people's recognition of the



sacredness and sanctity of human life. It is helpful to call to mind the confession of the two greatest Hebrew prophets, Isaiah about 750 years before the birth of Jesus, and a hundred years later, Jeremiah. Apparently, many people of our time, like the people at Nazareth in Jesus' time, fail to admit that God is present in the existence of God's creation; that God is the author of all lives; that God is the form-er/potter of humans; that God determines when to initiate and when to terminate a creature.

Following the passage proclaimed in the second reading last Sunday where Saint Paul defines that each one of believers of Christ is a part of one body and that they are to participate in and with one another to make a healthy body. Today he continues with urging his audience to "strive eagerly for the greatest of spiritual gifts" through "a still more excellent way," LOVE. He goes on to define what this love is (patience, kindness) and isn't (jealousy, pomposity, inflation, rudeness, quick temper); and what this love does (bears, hopes, and endures all things, rejoices with the truth), and doesn't (seek its own interest, brood over injury, rejoice over wrongdoing).

In the various ways we might define LOVE (agape/charity) in our own circumstances, may the Spirit of Jesus enlighten and guide, and may the courage of Saint Paul sustain each one of us as we "put aside childish things" and seek to become the creature fully formed in the hand of God.

Maria De Mattias was born on Feb. 4, 1805, into a privileged family in the small mountain village of Vallecorsa, Italy. Due to political and social upheaval in Italy at the time, many people lacked the good quality of life that she enjoyed. But even with all of her privilege, she had to teach herself to read and write because women did not receive formal education at the time. She felt a calling at a young age to change that.

She believed that the calling was from God and experienced a mystical vision at 16 that ignited her passion for improving the lives of those in her community.

Over the next 32 years, Maria de Mattias established nearly 70 schools, most of them in under-served towns and rural areas. On the advice of St. Gaspar del Bufalo, C.PP.S., founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and with the help of her mentor Giovanni Merlini, C.PP.S., Maria founded on Mar. 4, 1834, the Congregation of the Sisters Adorers of the Blood of Christ. She died in 1866.


Throughout her life, other women joined her work, forming a community that eventually opened mis-

sions in Europe, the United States, China, Brazil, Congo, Australia, and other places throughout the world. Maria was canonized in 2003, recognized for her missionary zeal. Her commitment, compassion, and courage continue to inspire those who hear her story.






