



From the Desk of the Pastor

Almost two weeks ago Fr. Lac and I, along with a number of companions from the local area, traveled to Indianapolis, IN, gathering with a number of Precious Blood members and companions to elect leadership for the newly formed United States Province, combining the Kansas City and Cincinnati provinces into one province. The newly elected leadership of the recently formed province are: Father Jeff Kirch (provincial), Fr. Joseph Nassel (vice provincial), and councilors, Fr. Ben Berinti, Fr. Ron Will, and Br. Daryl Charron. The five of them, with the assistance of all the members and companions, will now establish a province center to facilitate a coordinated transition of the newly elected leadership and organizational aspects of the new province.



I share all of this information since St. Francis Xavier Parish has been under the pastoral leadership of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood since the inception of the parish in 1890. There certainly are no immediate plans to change the course of Precious Blood involvement of this parish, and hopefully this parish will continue to be served by the Priests, brothers, and companions of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood.

I want to share a little history of the development of establishing one U.S. Province. In the late 1800's the Precious Blood Community had been established as the American Province by men and women associated with the Missionary members out of Germany. In 1965, when the membership of Priests and brothers in the United States had increased to over five hundred, the community decided that it would be more effective if the province was divided into three U.S. provinces: The Pacific Province (the area from the ocean to the Rocky Mountains), the Kansas City Province (from the Rockies to the Mississippi River), and the Cincinnati Province (from the Mississippi to the East Coast). In the '90's the Pacific Province dissolved due to finances and diminishment of numbers. Vocations to religious communities and dioceses were prospering during the '50's and 60's, which changed the dynamics of the Missionaries. It was also a misnomer by now to call this province the American Province since a new Province was begun in Canada (Atlantic Province), and Mexico, Central and South America which had been elevated into missions, directed by the Cincinnati Province, which have just recently become the Latin American Province. Companions (lay associates with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood) were formed in the 80's, who have graced the parish of St. Francis Xavier since that time, along with many communities throughout the world.

The number of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood has diminished since the '60's when the Kansas City Province itself had around one hundred and thirty members. Today the numbers of the newly formed United States Province equals the membership of the Kansas City Province in the '60's. Because there are fewer men and women entering religious communities, or dioceses for that matter, it definitely is affecting pastoral leadership in our parishes. We need to keep praying for religious vocations, and the Church needs to call on the Holy Spirit to guide us to live Church in new ways. Continue to pray for vocations to the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and to all religious communities and dioceses throughout the world.







Saint of the Week



Saint Junípero Serra, a Franciscan friar, began his professional life as a Spanish university professor. A gifted scholar, even before his ordination in 1738, he was assigned to teach philosophy in his community. In 1743 he received his doctorate in theology and taught for 5 years at Lullian University. But his heart's desire was to become a missionary. And in 1749 he was dis-

patched to serve at the Apostolic College of San Fernando in Mexico City.

From 1750-1758, Fra Junípero governed the 5 missions to Pame Indians in the Sierra Gorda mountains. There the learned scholar trained himself in missionary skills and methods. He decided that to bring the natives to Christ he would have to become one of them. So he mastered their language, treated them as equals, and daily worked side-by-side with them in the fields. Then beginning in 1758 he spent 11 years working at missions throughout Mexico and Lower California.

In 1769 he established his first mission at San Diego. Between 1770-1782, Fra Junípero founded 8 more missions, including San Francisco and San Carlos at Monterey-Carmel, which became his base. The spiritual well-being of the Indians dominated Serra's concerns. At the California missions Fra Junípero baptized 6,000 Indians and confirmed 5,000. He died at Carmel in 1784.

Junípero Serra also improved the material welfare of the natives. For example, his introduction of agricultural methods and tools afforded them a better quality of life.




