

FROM FATHER TIMOTHY CLOUTIER

THE ONLY WAY TO GET MORE OUT OF MASS IS BY PUTTING MORE INTO IT (Part 1)

It's not just young people who often say that Mass is boring, that they don't get anything out of it, and that Mass is irrelevant to their lives. A lot of Catholics of my own generation and older than me say that, too. So, I personally thank God daily for the solid and thorough catechesis I received in my family and in Catholic religious education in the early '60s. Then, almost overnight, everything collapsed, and entire generations were denied the fuller understanding of the precious gift of the Mass and the other Sacraments in what passed for "religious education" programs in the decades that followed. Even today, I fear most of these programs fall seriously short on this extremely important topic. Here's some of what I received.

To begin with, we need to keep the order of things clear: the Mass is fundamentally an act of God, and not merely the actions of the community, as in non-Catholic worship services: "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you" (see John 15:16). The essence of appreciating the Mass – and of "getting anything out of it" – is to have a clearer understanding of just what it is that God is saying and doing through it, not just the words of the Scriptures and of the Liturgy, but what the gestures, ceremonies and ritual tell and remind us about God, about his love of us, his will for us, his closeness to us, his concern that we love and serve one another following his own example. The liturgy of the Mass is, therefore, a school of divine thought and of the divine will for us.

The sacramental nature of the Holy Eucharist, of course, goes far beyond that, but it is in the context of the Mass – ceremonies, gestures, scripture readings, and prayers – that we are invited into a deeper and fuller understanding of it. We might consider the Sacrifice and Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist like a precious jewel, and the liturgy of the Mass the finely-worked gold setting that holds it, not giving it its intrinsic value, but enhancing its value in the eyes of the one who looks at it. SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT SUNDAY 12th, MOST HOLY TRINITY:

Proverbs 8:22-31 If we can be so awestruck and overwhelmed contemplating the wisdom of God in his Creation, how much more should we be in contemplating the inexpressible greatness and depth of knowledge of the Trinity of God himself?

Romans 5:1-5 The "peace we have with God" comes from the restoration through Christ of his image in us, and "the hope of the glory of God" is its fullness in heaven.

St. John 16:12-15 "The Spirit of truth, [who] will lead you to all truth" does not only concern our limited knowledge of the Trinity of the Godhead, but also the fuller understanding of ourselves: our origin and our identity, our dignity and our eternal destiny.




