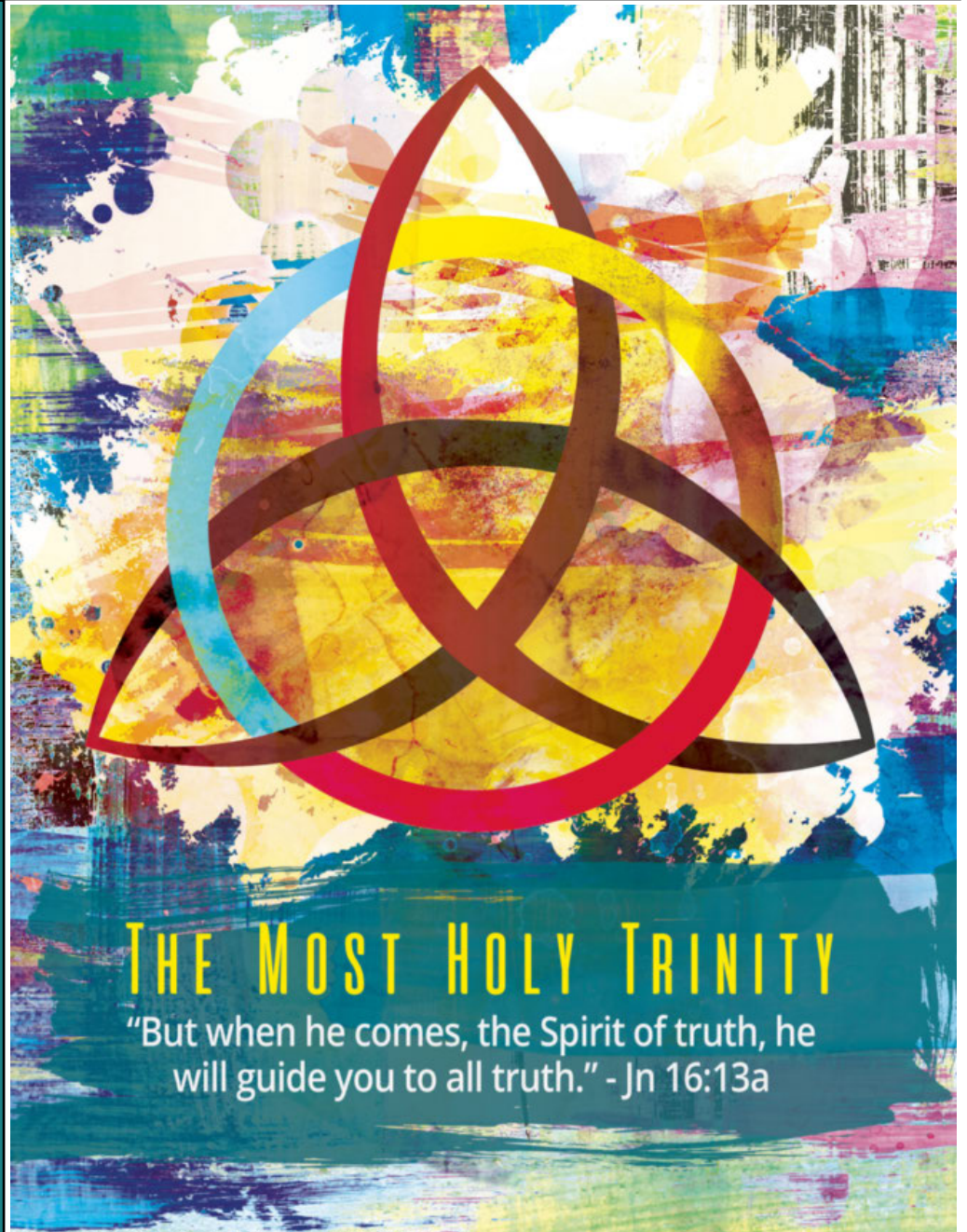

# FROM FATHER TIMOTHY CLOUTIER

## THE ONLY WAY TO GET MORE OUT OF MASS IS BY PUTTING MORE INTO IT (Part 2)

I wrote in last weekend's article that the Sacrifice and Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist is like a precious jewel, and the liturgy of the Mass the finely-worked gold setting that holds it, not giving it its intrinsic value, but enhancing its value in the eyes of the one who looks at it. So, it's not the liturgy – the setting – that should be our focus in “getting anything out of Mass,” but the Eucharist itself – the jewel.

The Holy Eucharist as Sacrifice-offered and Sacrament-received brings us in contact with God's own love for each one of us and thus confers meaning and purpose on everything that goes to make up our lives and conscious activity. The people entering into the Promised Land were told that “... they shall not appear before the Lord empty-handed” (Exodus 16:16 [15-17]); so also us. Whenever we approach the altar-table of the Lord we can't come empty-handed if we want to truly be a part of what God is doing at Mass. We need to bring the fruits of our labors to do God's will in our daily lives: our efforts, our successes and our failures, our concerns and our hopes, our burdens and our joys, our thanksgiving and our prayers of petition for God's help and blessing on what lies ahead. So, what does God do with all of this? Here is the key to “getting out of Mass what we should: in offering to God every aspect of our lives – our very selves – we open our lives to God's presence, guidance, blessing and power, and to the greater understanding of God's will and God's ways in our life.

Finally, the “Amen” we say when presented the Holy Eucharist at Communion is not only a personal affirmation of faith in the true Presence of the body, soul, humanity and divinity of Jesus Christ in the appearances of bread and wine, but a reaffirmation of our commitment to the covenant relationship that God has entered into with us in the body and blood of his own beloved Son, Jesus Christ.

God is never outdone in generosity, and in the measure we allow God into our lives in this way, the more we will perceive his goodness and receive more out of being a conscientious participant in, and a very part of the Mass we celebrate.

## SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT SUNDAY JUNE 19TH, MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST:

**Genesis 14:18-20** The central figure here is not the Patriarch Abraham, but the mysterious priest Melchizedek who is a figure of the eternal Priest, Jesus Christ, whose priesthood brings blessing to us, the spiritual children of Abraham,

**I Corinthians 11:23-26** As already an established practice in the early Church, St. Paul here gives further instruction on the eschatological (End-times) optic of the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrifice-Sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood: Christians look forward to the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus.

**St. Luke 9:11b-17** The overabundance provided for all in the multiplication of the loaves and fish indicates the same value of the Eucharist: to provide fully for every honest desire and the deepest longings of the human heart and soul that God alone can give.
