FROM FATHER PHILIPPE VIGNERON

“My Divine Heart is so inflamed with love for men”

We just celebrated the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus last Friday. This celebration was asked by Jesus himself, to a humble nun, Saint Margaret Mary, in 1675. He said to her: “Behold the Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming Itself, in order to testify Its love; and in return, I receive from the greater part only ingratitude, by their irreverence and sacrilege, and by the coldness and contempt they have for Me in this Sacrament of Love. I ask of you that the Friday after the Octave of Corpus Christi be set apart for a special feast to honor my heart, by communicating on that day, and making reparation to it by a solemn act, in order to make amends for the indignities which it has received during the time it has been exposed on the altars. I promise you that my heart shall expand itself to shed in abundance the influence of its divine love upon those who shall thus honor it, and cause it to be honored.”

Saint Margaret Mary received the mission to tell the World that the Divine Heart of Jesus “is so inflamed with love for men, [] that, being unable any longer to contain within Itself the flames of Its burning Charity, It must needs spread them abroad by your means, and manifest Itself to them (mankind) in order to enrich them with the precious graces of sanctification and salvation necessary to withdraw them from the abyss of perdition.”

Jesus died for me, because He loves me, and He wants me to believe it. I gave his life, because he suffers to see me disfigured by my sins while, what I truly am, is the beloved son of the Father. Therefore, I invite you, dear brothers and sisters, to make that simple exercise: every time we make the sign of the Cross, let us take one or two seconds to remember that reality. We are so blessed to have been given the catholic faith. We need to realize a little more, every day, the greatness and beauty of the Divine Revelation. I pray for each one of us, that we could be overwhelmed by the Love of God, especially when we participate in the Eucharist, and when we adore the Blessed Sacrament. May we be so filled with the Love of God, that we shall burn with the desire to share it!

Quick presentation of Fr. Philippe Vigneron

I was born in the suburb of Paris (France), in 1979, in a catholic family. I have a sister and a brother; I’m the youngest. I studied science (mainly physics) and worked for 4 years for the French government as an IT engineer, and eventually became a seminarian for the Diocese of Paris. I was ordained in Notre-Dame in 2015 and served as a parochial vicar. Like Fr. Andrew, I’m also a member of the Emmanuel Community: an international charismatic community that started in France. I was sent to the USA to be the director of our School of Mission in the Bronx, but Covid has ended that mission. My Community asked me to be available for the mission in the US. I’ve eventually been assigned to your Parish, to serve with Fr. Andrew and share the graces of our community according to the will of Archbishop Hebda.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, 14 TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

Isaiah 66:10-14c: Jerusalem is fulfilled as an image of the Church, and thus, as a promise of what God will do on behalf of all those who dwell in her through faith.

Galatians 6:14-18: The “new creation” which God creates in the believing soul will bring “peace and mercy, “and upon whom will come “the grace of our Lord, Jesus Christ.”

St. Luke 10:1-12, 17-20: As the disciples go out “in pairs to every town and place [Jesus] intended to visit,” they were thus to witness both to their trust in God to provide for the work entrusted to them, and to the love for each other that they were to preach.
