

# FROM FATHER ANDREW BRINKMAN

### Letters from Lake Como:

I admit that its risky to present a quotation out of context, but I nonetheless share with you some insights from a book I recently read, one from the highly quotable Msgr. Ronald Knox. The title is a Hidden Stream, a brief presentation of Catholicism.

Saint Augustine, reacting from the Pelagic menace, put us all into a very uncomfortable frame of mind about it. "This was the state of affairs," he tells us, after the fall. "The whole human race, a doomed mass, lay there, wallowing in calamity, went crashing down from one depth of calamity to the next, enfeoffed to the party of the apostate angels, and paying the deserved penalty of its impious rebellion." –57

I've been wallowing in the Old Testament for the last two years or more, as few people are ever in a position to wallow in it, and I simply can't get over the extraordinariness of the Jewish people. I mean, even if you approach the Old Testament without any belief in inspiration, without any prejudice in favor of its accuracy, there is something obstinately Providential about the story of the Jews. Even if Christianity had never happened, it would still challenge belief, the way in which this tiny nation has drawn a trail of theology over the face of history; the way in which all its literature, reduces itself to an epic of the soul. Let me rough out for your lines of that epic in very brief form. -73

It is a good thing to drink a glass of wine; as Saint Thomas says, "If a man deliberately abstains from wine to such an extent that he does serious harm to his nature, he will not be free from blame." But if the glass of wine happens to be the fifteenth you have taken that evening, it is the wrong good in that particular context. —189

Not to know about God, but to know God—that is the ambition of the mystic. -129

It was all or nothing; and, as most of us know, Saint Augustine saw nothing inappropriate in condemnation to hell of all infants that had died without baptism. —145

Magic, surely, means using supernatural means—or so they are regarded—to produce a natural effect; to cure an illness, to get the wireworm out of the mealie-crop, something of that kind...After all, in a primitive society the medicine man is not the forerunner of the priest, he is the forerunner of the scientist. —202

In arguing, never disguise from yourself the strength of the other man's case. —208 And for good measure, a quotation from the same Author's book, Mass in Slow Motion: If only people would take the trouble to avoid deliberate venial sins, the world would be a much happier place. —75

### VIOLENCE STRIKES AGAIN

Dear Parishioners,

On August 1st, Abria Pregnancy Resource Center located in St. Paul was vandalized. The main entry doors were smashed open with a rock and the words "If Abortions aren't safe, neither are you" were spray painted in red across our windows. They did not enter or steal anything from the building. None of Abria's clients or staff were hurt.

This marks one of over 60 pregnancy centers and Prolife affiliated organizations damaged. Three in the Twin Cities alone. One group claiming responsibility for much of the damage, "Jane Sent Us" declared this summer "A Summer of Rage". We counter that with additional prayers and a commitment to make this "A Summer of Service" The media is not reporting any of this violence so it is up to us to stay informed. This week, the Maternity of Mary/Holy Childhood Prolife Group donated \$200 to Abria to help defray the cost of repairing the damage, but if you are interested in donating as well, you can donate online at www.supporters.abria.org.






### **Calling all Substitute Teachers!**
