OUR JOURNEY TO CHRIST

“Where is the newborn king of the Jews?
We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.”
(Matthew 2:2)

Pope Benedict XVI looks at the pilgrimage of the wise men as a new beginning...which “represents the journeying of humanity toward Christ. They initiate a procession that continues throughout history. Not only do they represent the people who have found the way to Christ: they represent the inner aspiration of the human spirit, the dynamism of religions and human reason toward him.” (Jesus of Nazareth, II, 97 p)

When are we going to begin our journey to Christ? If we are either looking for an opportune time or given a marginalized response to the call of Christ, we should rethink our response. Time exists because of the Incarnate Savior. Time is filled with the fullness of Christ’s love and goodness. We should begin now. We should not fear of losing anything because everything is returned to us as gain—and as abundance in His sight.

The beginning and the end of this pilgrimage is Christ. If we remain faithful to our desire, we will say, as Augustine said, “Late have I loved you, O Beauty, so ancient, and ever new! For behold, you were inside me, but I was outside, and sought you there... You were with me, but I was not with You. Things kept me far from You.....You called, and cried aloud, and broke open my deafness. You gleamed and shined, and chased away my blindness. You breathed out odors, and I drew in my breath, and now I breathe heavily for You I tasted, and now I hunger and thirst. You touched me, and I burned for Your peace.” (Confessions 10.27)

As we begin this new year, I pray that we make our pilgrimage to the Incarnate Savior. And no matter how unworthy and far gone we feel, if we invest everything we are and have in search of the God who dwelt amongst us, we will find Him lying in a manger hungering for our salvation!

No debemos temer perder nada porque todo nos es devuelto como ganancia y como abundancia a sus ojos.

El principio y el final de esta peregrinación es Cristo. Si permanecemos fieles a nuestro deseo, diremos, como dijo Agustín: “Tarde te amé, oh Belleza, tan antigua y siempre nueva! Porque he aquí, tú estabas dentro de mí, pero yo estaba fuera, y allí te buscaba... Tú estabas conmigo, pero yo no estaba contigo. Las cosas me mantuvieron lejos de ti ... Tú llamaste, y gritaste fuerte, y rompiste mi sordera. Resplandeciste y resplandeciste, y alejaste mi ceguera. Expiraste olores y yo respiré, y ahora respiro pesadamente por Ti.... Probé, y ahora tengo hambre y sed. Tú me tocaste y yo ardí por tu paz ”. (Confesiones 10.27)

Al comenzar este nuevo año, oro para que hagamos nuestro peregrinaje al Salvador Encarnado. Y no importa cuán indignos y lejanos nos sintamos, si invertimos todo lo que somos y tenemos en la búsqueda del Dios que moraba entre nosotros, ¡lo encontraremos acostado en un pesebre hambriento de nuestra salvación!





LEARN ABOUT POVERTY

Did you know? Poverty does not strike all demographics equally. For example, in 2018, 10.6% of men, and 12.9% of women lived in Poverty USA. Along the same lines, the poverty rate for married couples in 2018 was only 4.7% - but the poverty rate for single-parent families with no wife present was

12.7%, and for single-parent families with no husband present was 24.9%. In 2018, the poverty rate for people living with a disability was 25.7%. That's nearly 4 million people living with a disability—in poverty.

GO MORE IN-DEPTH

Hunger: A Faith and Justice Response is an 8-session, prayerful process that includes study, rich dialogue, and an immersion experience. This program inspires and equips participants to take concrete action to end hunger and food insecurity.

The course may challenge your thinking about food insecurity, its causes, its impact, and viable steps to eliminate it. The class explores issues such as food deserts, underemployment and food insecurity, food waste, public policy around farming, and COVID-19's impact on hunger. PRAYER PRACTICE

BLESSING OF THE HOME ON EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The traditional date of Epiphany is January 6, but in the United States it is celebrated on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8.



When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung. The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply, "Amen."

The leader greets those present in the following words:

Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever.

R/. Blessed be God forever.

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Luke 19:1-9:

Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature.

So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham."

The intercessions are then said:

Leader: The Son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him.

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, you had no place to lay your head, but in the spirit of poverty accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your greater glory. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer.

BECOMING CATHOLIC

The leader says the prayer of blessing with hands joined:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them (us) with the light of Christ, that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever.

R/. Amen.

It is preferable to end the celebration with a suitable song, for example, "O Come, All Ye Faithful" or "We Three Kings."




ALL HOUSEHOLDS, ALL AGES!

SAINT JOHN NEUMANN: JANUARY 5

A native of Bohemia, John entered the seminary and was nearing ordination when he departed for the United States. He joined the Redemptorists and served as a priest in New York, Maryland and Pennsylvania. In 1852 he was named the fourth bishop of Philadelphia. He founded more than 50 churches and greatly expanded Catholic education. John had a fondness for immigrants and knew six languages. His pastoral zeal was evident up to his last moments of life. He collapsed and died in the street at age 48.
