## FEBRUARY 7, 2021: FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**“Jesus approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up.”**

**(Mark 1: 31)**

Overwhelmed by life’s challenges and weighed down by pain and suffering, we may, like job, feel God’s absence, betrayal, and indifference.

Yet, God never abandons us. God is always present in our lives. Indeed, the Evangelist points to an urgency about restoring the deformed to wholeness. As the healing of Simon’s mother-in-law demonstrates, **the Incarnate Savior approaches the deformed, embraces her, and helps her up.**

In my infirmity, I have felt God’s loving closeness, solidarity, and His steadfast kindness. It is His loving embrace that secures my happiness and peace. In silent prayer, I bring my sin. I beg for His love, forgiveness, and accompaniment. Without His abiding presence, I will remain in darkness.

Mark accounts: “Then the fever left her and she began to wait on them.” Our healing and transformation are always for others. It draws us outward to serving the needs of others. We are **sent forth** to announce the joy of the gospel.

As we journey through this week, let us surrender our deformities to the transformation of our Savior. He desires to be close to us, to hold us in His loving embrace, and to help us walk again in His presence.

Don’t we desire His healing? I do, let’s begin again, this week!

# OUTREACH UPDATE

## IOPPA SIX-MONTH REVIEW

We are so grateful to St. Boniface for supporting the JOPPA outreach ministry even during these unprecedented times.

Over the past six months, the JOPPA ministry has:

- Assembled and delivered twenty-two **Welcome Baskets** to new clients placed in housing
- Visited thirty clients through our **Circle of Friends** team, providing much needed support and fellowship
- Designated funds for high-need items: tents, heater systems and fuel, and winter survival kit items such as “hot-hands” and warm socks.
- Allocated funds for the Christmas Program

In summary, we donated 237 volunteer hours and over \$15,000 in support of JOPPA! Thank you for your support, we can't do it without you!

## EL SALVADOR REFLECTION

As the year came to an end, it was wonderful to see how much your generosity accomplished in the last quarter of 2020 for families in El Salvador.

We were able to support families in El Recreo with medications, diagnostic tests, transportation for medical procedures and other emergencies, supplies for health center, vehicle repairs and other needs of Green Commandos (Berlin), assistance to Hector's Indigo Shop and classroom, formational assistance to three seminarians from the Diocese of *Santiago de Maria* (Usulután), board and lodging assistance 2 college students, food supplies for the aged and elderly, and Christmas food baskets for families.

In the next few weeks, El Recreo will resume school online. We will renew our commitment to support their school supplies and to provide scholarships. Just like in Iowa, there may be possible expenses for corn or fertilizer depending on how the weather goes and the crop develops in El Recreo. The COVID-19 seems to be calm in El Salvador, but we know that it is not gone yet. The families are patient and support each other.

It is amazing how little I feel I can do, but when I just keep doing, it becomes so much. That's how I felt when I first wanted to do something for our families in El Salvador and felt helpless to make a difference. I just said a prayer and kept doing.

# FOR THE CHILDREN: CLOW

We are pleased to announce that “Children’s Liturgy of the Word” (also known as CLOW) for families with children 4-7 years old will be offered as part of our **Sunday 8:30am Mass** beginning **February 28** and continuing through **May 23**.

## A few things for you to know:

**What?** Children’s Liturgy of the Word is a worship experience geared especially for kids. It mirrors the worship experience of the larger community, with a style that is engaging and interactive. Jesus recognized that children have a pure spirituality, and he made them the primary spiritual model for all of us!

**Why?** The Word of God has a message that is as relevant for children as it is for adults. Often children fail to hear the message because they’re unable to comprehend adult vocabulary. CLOW helps children to hear the Scripture in words they understand and to share their own understanding.

**Who?** Here at St. Boniface, we invite children ages 4-7 to participate in Children’s Liturgy of the Word. As the primary faith formators in your home, we invite one or both parents to accompany your child the first time they attend CLOW. This allows you to see and hear firsthand what your child sees and hears. After that, we encourage children to attend on their own, but parents (or older siblings) are always welcome if the younger child needs support.




**How?** CLOW begins with the Introductory Rites of the Mass, with children seated in the larger assembly with their families. After the Collect (also known as the opening prayer), Father will invite children to stand in the pews with their families, receive a blessing, then move respectfully to the parish hall to join their session leaders. Children return to their family after the Prayer of the Faithful and celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist and the rest of Mass with the entire community.

**COVID and safe environment guidelines.** Due to the current pandemic, children and parents participating in CLOW will need to wear masks and remain socially distanced in the parish hall. Adult leaders and assistants are also required to complete Diocesan safe environment guidelines.

**We need your help!** While one parish family has graciously offered to serve in a leadership role, in order to offer and sustain CLOW for our families, we need additional leaders and assistants. Teens are welcome to inquire, too! Please prayerfully consider how you may be called to support this ministry!

So, here's some more help as you journey with your child to their first celebration of the beautiful, healing sacrament of reconciliation!

## SAINT JOSEPHINE BAKHITA:

### FEBRUARY 8

“It is an act of justice for the rich to help the poor.”

Saint Josephine, affectionately known as Bakhita (“fortunate one”), was born in the southern Sudan region of Darfur. She was kidnapped as a child and sold into slavery, eventually working in Italy as a nanny for a wealthy family.

During this time she was introduced to formal religion and came to know the Daughters of Charity of Canossa. Bakhita was drawn to the Catholic Church, baptized in 1890, and given the name Josephine. Six years later she entered the Canossian Sisters convent in Schio, Italy.

At her canonization ceremony on October 1, 2000, Pope John Paul II said of St. Josephine: “In today’s world, countless women continue to be victimized, even in developed modern societies.

In St. Josephine Bakhita we find a shining advocate of genuine emancipation. The history of her life inspires not passive acceptance but the firm resolve to work effectively to free girls and women from oppression and violence, and to return them to their dignity in the full exercise of their rights.”
