A Note from Fr. Kevin

December 26 - "St. Stephen and the Christmas Miracle"

Merry Christmas and Blessed "Christmastide!" We not only have a day but a whole season of Christmas containing various celebrations that help us reflect more deeply on the story and Mystery of Christmas and Christ's Incarnation.

One ancient tradition in the Church is that the day after Christmas, December 26, is the Feast of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. It seems like a bit of an odd thing to celebrate the first Christian death, right after celebrating the birth of Christ.

But here is the story of why we celebrate Saint Stephen the martyr the day after Christmas.

The following is adapted from article from the National Catholic Register by Thomas J. Craughwell:

In the year 415, a priest named Lucian (who lived near Jerusalem) one night, when he was half awake, he saw an elderly man who said, "I am Gamaliel." (Gamaliel was a Sadducee who taught St. Paul and who, according to tradition, secretly became a Christian. He is referenced in Acts 5:34-29 and Acts 22:3).

In Lucian's vision, Gamaliel told Lucian the location of the tomb of St. Stephen (As Gamaliel himself had taken and entombed the body of St. Stephen), which had been lost and forgotten for centuries. The lost tomb was not far from Lucian's church. God had sent Gamaliel to Lucian because he wanted the relics enshrined in churches where, he said, "through their means, God might open to many the gates of His mercy."

Lucian did indeed find the remains of St. Stephen where Gamaliel had told him. At this news, the Bishop with a large crowd came to the tomb. He placed the bones of St. Stephen in a chest. As he did so, more than 70 witnesses who suffered from a variety of serious ailments, were healed. The date of the recovery of the relics of St. Stephen was Dec. 26, 415, which is why we celebrate the feast of St. Stephen on Dec. 26.

This discovery sent a surge of religious joy through the Christian world. Saint Augustine recorded many stories of the miraculous healings God granted through the intercession of St. Stephen, many of which he knew firsthand, because often he knew the person who had been healed

One of his stories is that in a procession with the relics of St. Stephen, a blind woman was led to where the bishop was carrying the reliquary. The woman asked if she was near the saint. The bishop said yes, and gave her one of the flowers that decorated the reliquary. The woman applied the petals to her eyes, and immediately her sight was restored.

So while it may seem strange to celebrate the first Christian martyr after the celebration of the birth of Christ, we can see that in God's coming, God transforms the things of death into things of life. Through St. Stephen God uses Stephen's own death, and even his tomb and bones by the power of Christ to bring about for many, unexpected Christmas miracles of miraculous healings and thus the surprise of Christmas joy!

Una nota del P. Kevin

26 de diciembre - "San Esteban y el milagro de Navidad"

Feliz navidad y bendita "¡Ola Navideña!" No sólo tenemos un día, sino toda una temporada navideña que contiene varias celebraciones que nos ayudan a reflexionar más profundamente sobre la historia y el Misterio de la Navidad y la Encarnación de Cristo.

Una tradición antigua en la Iglesia es que el día después de Navidad, el 26 de diciembre, es la fiesta de San Esteban, el primer mártir cristiano. Parece un poco extraño celebrar la primera muerte cristiana, justo después de celebrar el nacimiento de Cristo.

Pero aquí está la historia de por qué celebramos a San Esteban mártir el día después de Navidad.

El siguiente es una adaptación del artículo del National Catholic Register de Thomas J. Craughwell:

En el año 415, un sacerdote llamado Luciano (que vivía cerca de Jerusalén) una noche, cuando estaba medio despierto, vio a un anciano que decía "Soy Gamaliel". (Gamaliel fue un saduceo que enseñó a San Pablo y que, según la tradición, se hizo cristiano en secreto. Se hace referencia a él en Hechos 5:34-29 y Hechos 22:3).

En la visión de Luciano, Gamaliel le dijo a Luciano la ubicación de la tumba de San Esteban (como el propio Gamaliel había tomado y sepultado el cuerpo de San Esteban), que se había perdido y olvidado durante siglos. La tumba perdida no estaba lejos de la iglesia de Luciano. Dios había enviado a Gamaliel a Luciano porque quería que las reliquias fueran consagradas en iglesias donde, dijo, "por medio de ellos, Dios podría abrir a muchos las puertas de su misericordia".

Luciano sí encontró los restos de San Esteban donde Gamaliel le había dicho. Ante esta noticia, el obispo con una gran multitud se acercó a la tumba. Colocó los huesos de San Esteban en un cofre. Mientras lo hacía, más de 70 testigos que sufrían una variedad de dolencias graves fueron sanados. La fecha de la recuperación de las reliquias de San Esteban fue el 26 de diciembre de 415, razón por la cual celebramos la fiesta de San Esteban el 26 de diciembre.

Este descubrimiento envió una oleada de alegría religiosa a través del mundo cristiano. San Agustín registró muchas historias de curaciones milagrosas que Dios concedió por intercesión de San Esteban, muchas de las cuales conocía de primera mano, porque a menudo conocía a la persona que había sido sanada.

Una de sus historias es que en una procesión con las reliquias de San Esteban, una mujer ciega fue llevada hasta donde el obispo llevaba el relicario. La mujer preguntó si estaba cerca del santo. El obispo dijo que sí y le entregó una de las flores que decoraban el relicario. La mujer se aplicó los pétalos en los ojos e inmediatamente recuperó la vista.

Entonces, si bien puede parecer extraño celebrar al primer mártir cristiano después de la celebración del nacimiento de Cristo, podemos ver que en la venida de Dios, Él transforma las cosas de la muerte en cosas de vida. A través de San Esteban, Dios usa la propia muerte de Esteban, e incluso su tumba y huesos por el poder de Cristo para producir para muchos, milagros navideños inesperados de curaciones milagrosas y, por lo tanto, ¡la sorpresa de la alegría navideña!


