PASTOR'S PEN ...a word from the heart



There is no greater blessing than that of a grateful heart. Among the many graces of November is its reminder to us of all that we have and all that we need. In the church, this month begins with our focus upon the brevity of life and our close connection with deceased loved ones

who we commend to God and the next world. In our remembrances, we offer thanks for their spiritual presence, even their guidance. We also pray for the poor souls in purgatory who seek the fullness of grace in heaven. In these offerings, we realize that we are all related, connected as Jesus said, and need to urge each other onward and upward to heaven.

As the month continues, we place emphasis on the riches we possess. We sometimes might feel like the title character of *Silas Marner* by George Eliot who was alone and desolate. Each night he counted his money because it was all he had—till it was stolen; then a helpless child entered his life and gave him a purpose for living and a reason to love. November challenges us to understand that we possess a large cornucopia of blessings—more than we need. Yet we are also mindful that much has been taken away. As one prayer lays it out: *“For all that has been given to me, for all that has been taken away, and for all that remains, I thank you, Lord.”* Upon holy reflection, we realize that it is still a beautiful world and that we have much to love and purpose for being. Mindful of what has been given to us, especially the gift of time, and all that has been taken away, including our dear family members and friends, we should be most thankful for what remains and what has entered our lives of late and treasure them beyond measure.

November starts the wind down of each calendar year, and many will be happy to see this one wind down. We look to happier days ahead—not just in 2021 as we get a better handle on Covid-19 but immediately, as we celebrate Thanksgiving Day and inaugurate another holiday season with all necessary social limitations. Though I don't think we can bring an item from our holiday tables to place near the Eucharistic table this year for the morning Mass, I

think you can still bring some item (candle, bottle of wine, wrapped loaf of bread, decorative centerpiece) to lift up for blessing during the Mass. And though we cannot have a reception at church, we will have coffee on in the Gathering Space if any wish to stop in and offer a socially distanced Thanksgiving greeting to others. Ironically enough, what parishioners seem to value most in our community of faith is one another and we refrain from the interaction we treasure most. But we will, once again, get to reunite in the spirit of togetherness.

In the meantime, I have been so proud to be part of our parish that has utilized this time for numerous other improvements. Our school teachers have done a superlative job teaching amidst daily uncertainties and unpredictable forces. Volunteers have stepped forth to make our food pantry a staple commodity for families in our area who are down on their luck and in need of a little assistance during these trying times. Others have rolled up their sleeves to beautify our grounds and make our curb appeal as nice as any site in the northland. Still others are guiding pet projects for the holiday season, from The *Our Bags* program that supports our brothers and sisters at *The Bishop Sullivan Center*, to The annual *Guatemala* project that reaches hermanos y hermanas in Central America, to the upcoming *Little Plaza Lighting* ceremony touching our neighborhood with goodwill, and the *Borromeo Academy Prayer Luncheon* that assists scholars and families get a fantastic classical education here at Saint Charles. We have so many blessings!

Whether we're alone this holiday season, as *Silas Marner* usually found himself, or in the presence of family and friends within our orbit, we are called to have grateful hearts and be thankful for abundant graces bestowed upon us. Most of us have more than we need and so many of you are incredibly gracious with what you have. As we approach another season of gift-giving, let us be mindful of the greatest gift of all: life and life in Christ Jesus. The year 2020 has been filled with incredibly strange happenings. We don't want to live through another year like it—yet it has contained challenges that have potentially made us better people: more loving, more reflective, and more generous. *For all that has been given to us, for all that has been taken away, and for all that remains, we thank you, Lord.*

There Is Much to Be Done

Growing up Catholic means I must have heard a million times the passage in Matthew's Gospel about how doing things for the "least of these" means you have done them for Jesus. Okay, that is an exaggeration to make a point. But it has been a slogan for so many social justice activities, from clothing and canned food drives, to letter writing campaigns and peaceful protests.

Growing up I only knew how to help the least of these through the school and church activities of the time. Today, YouTube and GodTube are filled with videos of creative ways people reach out to one another. Have you seen the one about the pizza party for the homeless? How about the fake lottery ticket or the house bought from online donations for a poor man? There are even videos of people paying for the car behind them at the drive-through! The awesome thing about this is that it serves as a witness to others. It is not boasting but instead sharing the Good News. Giving and good stewardship can be contagious!

Our pastor has several times over the years handed out \$10 bills to confirmation candidates and asked them to "pay it forward." They can keep the money or use it to make a difference in someone else's life. One teen planted a garden for an elderly woman. One bought ingredients for brownies and sold them to give even more than \$10 to charity. The teens not only learned something about good stewardship in the process, but also served as great examples to the parish community.

As always, there is much to be done. The King is coming soon! Let's spread the news and some love at the same time!


Donating Securities and Mutual Funds

This value is deductible up to 30% of the donor's adjusted gross income and can be carried over for up to five years after the year of the gift. Please consult your financial or legal adviser.

Giving directly from your IRA to a qualified charity like your parish, school, Annual Catholic Appeal, diocesan or parish ministry can be a tax-wise strategy. Please consult you legal or tax adviser or Laura Gray at the Office of Stewardship and Development at gray@diocesekcsj.org or 816-714-2363. Gifts of this type satisfy your "required minimum distribution (rmd)" and will help you avoid paying income tax on whatever amount you transfer directly to charity.


