

PASTOR'S PEN ...a word from the heart



Catholic Schools Week is always a highlight of the academic year for parishes. Each winter quarter, it offers a breath of fresh air to the drab and cold backdrop of the season. Unfortunately, like many alterations made during Covid's reign, we cannot offer tours or in-

person gatherings to show-off Borromeo Academy this year, but we can still celebrate it and promote it to our friends and neighbors, inviting them to come and see what we are all about.

Like many of our teachers, parents, and staff, I am extremely grateful to Dr. Karen Hopson, our principal, who came to us in such a seamless fashion as though she was meant for the classic model. Her decades of experience as a teacher and administrator have been a tremendous blessing in assisting classrooms to function in optimal ways. Her Building Leadership Team, consisting of vice-principals, Karla Prewitt and Susie Henton, along with the Coordinator of our Early Childhood Center, Rebecca VanDyke, have been spectacular in guiding us all through this uniquely challenging year. At each grade level and in every curricular discipline we have fabulous educators who work together with children's best interest at heart.

This is the time of year in which we ask you to think about others in your life who might benefit from the education that we offer here at Borromeo. There may be some young family in your neighborhood or extended relations that would be a great part of our community and soar in this learning environment. This is also the time for pre-enrollment at Saint Pius X High School and all of our northland schools. If we can be of assistance with enrollment, scholarship, or financial aid forms, here or there, we will be glad to counsel and guide applicants through the process. There is a good feeling in the air about our Catholic

Schools in this region that I have not before felt in my four and a half years north of the river. This contagious spirit exudes happiness, holiness, and hope for our future and inspires family life while presenting great possibilities for youth.

It reminds me of a study conducted in the 1980s by two sociologists, James Coleman and Thomas Hoffer. Though neither is Catholic, nor did they have any vested interest in supporting Catholic education, it was touted as the strongest praise of Catholic Schools ever published. Their overwhelming data compiled through many years of research credited the chief value of Catholic schools to be based on their role as "*functional communities*" in which they are embraced by the very old and very young in particular regions because of their relationship to social outreach, faith, morality, worship, and daily priorities. These religious institutions that care for our young help to instill insights, attitudes, behaviors, and habits at a young age that help steer them in positive directions for life. While family structures and other strong traditional paradigms of success have deteriorated in the United States over the past half century, the Catholic Schools provide a structure that gives a solid foundation upon which families can build; the wider community that supports them can also be greatly impacted. These schools not only connect students, families, and faith communities with helpful paths in this world but also touch God's realm with the grace to dream of a better world. I think the northland is becoming one of those regions where such an impact takes hold.

So let it be known that Christ is the first teacher here and we are all on His team to pass to the next generation of Christians a better society. I am grateful to all who support our school, especially those who sponsor a scholar with tuition assistance. The annual *December Prayer Luncheon* was an abundant success last month, clearing over \$150,000.00. Though our enrollment did not increase this year as it had each of the previous years, it remained steady. Let's work together to increase it for next year. Then, I hope, we can get back to having our marvelous volunteer parishioners in the building to assist our children with their reading and other learning skills. It is such a blessing to have a school on our grounds.

This week, let's celebrate it. And please join the kids in collecting soup for our Soup-er Bowl festival!

Psalm:


Listen to the voice of God. (Psalm 95)

Gospel Meditation

Most of us are quiet people who desire to live a good and holy life, promote the values and mission of the Gospel as best we can and desire to one day inherit the surprise of life eternal God promises to us. We are not trail blazers. We are simple people who want to do the simple things of life well. But there are others who left a more profound impact along the way of the paths they walked. Folks like Dorothy Day, Martin Luther King, Thomas Merton, Gandhi, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and many others left lasting impacts and legacies. Like Moses, they show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose driven life look like. They show us how to be holy. We need Moses people like these to give us inspiration, hope and an example of holy living.

We do not need to do what they did or even mirror their relationship with God. Each one of us is God's special creation, with a purpose and soul known only to us. We need to learn how to open up and bring, without compromise, our soul-ness to life. We know when someone is authentic and centered because they always point to truth, even though they struggle and sin themselves, and they embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and it astonished many who listened. We do not need to move mountains, advance a cause, write books or become notable. All we have to do is become credible witnesses of the faith we profess. Moses people can teach us how to do this.

St. Oscar Romero was an amazing man and a Moses figure for sure. He saw God in the burning bush and brought the flame of Gospel faith to the poorest of the poor, challenging the evils of the society in which he lived. He was tireless and persistent. He must have gotten very close to the problem because it cost him his life. He suspected it would. St. Romero said, "When we leave Mass, we ought to go out the way Moses descended Mt Sinai: with his face shining, with his heart brave and strong to face the world's difficulties." We can learn from this wisdom. If we allow the power of the Mass to truly transform us, we will leave that holy encounter changed. Our face will shine, and we will have courage. We can then bring what we have received to life's challenges. That sounds doable, doesn't it? Because of the example of our simple holiness, people will be amazed.



Giving directly from your IRA to a qualified charity like your parish, school, Annual Catholic Appeal, diocesan or parish ministry can be a tax-wise strategy. Gifts of this type satisfy your "required minimum distribution (rmd)" and will help you avoid paying income tax on whatever amount you transfer directly to charity.



33 Day Consecration to St. Joseph




