Father Ronald Rolheiser tells the story of a four-year-old child who woke up one night afraid. She was convinced that in the darkness around her there were all kinds of spooks and monsters.

She ran to her parents' bedroom, where her mother calmed her. Taking the child by the hand, she led her back to her own room, put on a light, and assured her by saying: *"You don't need to be afraid because you're not alone here. God is with you in your room."* The child replied: *"I know that God is here, but I need someone in the room with me who has skin!"*

This story, essentially, points to Incarnation. It summarizes well the reason for Christmas. Our Jewish ancestors trusted that God was with them but they needed somebody in the flesh, someone with *skin in the game*. As we celebrate the days of Incarnation, nativity of the Messiah, let us consider more deeply what it means. *"Incarnation"* comes from the Latin *"carnus"* meaning meat, flesh, or skin. For God to be enfleshed, i.e., to put skin on, indicates that He is with us in a new way—no longer a distant deity that appeared to a few mortals in the history of humanity and spoke to a few more—now He is one of us. The Incarnation is a central tenant of Christianity.

The child in the story is not much different from a grown girl on a lonely road, a darkened alley, or late night campus. Talking on her cell phone to a friend or official helps but it does not take the place of somebody being there in person. It is similar with the rest of us who contend with eerie or frightening situations. Bible readers have noted that the phrase "Be

not afraid" or similar words appear 365 times in Sacred Scripture. It is a reminder that the Incarnation, though occurring one date on the calendar, is a gift everyday. Though God came to us in space and time and flesh at one place long ago, Christ is with us for all time.

Though God appeared to various patriarchs in The Torah, He did not appear to anyone after Moses. In fact, He told Moses that any one who saw His face would die, for He is too much to behold—even greater than looking at the sun. We can, however, see God in His various reflections: a glorious sunset, majestic mountain range, or white beaches that meet the vast horizon of a blue ocean... and we can encounter Him enfleshed in more common ways still: a piece of bread, a cup of wine, a smile, a warm coat, a soft bed, or a woman giving birth to a child. *"The Word became flesh and dwells among us."* It dwelt among certain people of a certain time and certain place, yet He dwells among us still.

Unlike many other religious spiritualities, Christian spirituality requires "enfleshment." It is not enough for us to believe in a God "out there" somewhere. We believe that God is one of us. We not only accept that He lived and died, resurrected and ascended, but also that He remains with us until the end of time. His body and blood, flesh and humanity, are living among us—and His spirit, too. The Holy Spirit rescues, comforts, and consoles us, like a mother assuring her frightened daughter that God is near. Being part of a community is essential to our Christian way of life. Like a parent that embraces a child, flesh on flesh, like a parishioner who reaches out to another or a struggling Catholic receiving Eucharist, we are one with Christ in the flesh. There is no Christmas gift even close to the Incarnation!



Saint of the Week

Not many saints can be relatable to our times, but St. Thomas Becket (December 21, 1118 – December 29, 1170) is one of the few. King Henry II, a good friend, made him chancellor of England at the age of 36. Then, despite St. Thomas Becket warning the king that he would not blindly follow his wishes, he was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162. Soon after, King Henry insisted upon seizing Church rights. In the name of peace, St. Thomas Becket came close to a compromise, and momentarily approved the Constitutions of Clarendon, which would have denied the clergy the right of trial by a Church court. But he later rejected this, and for his safety fled to France where he remained in exile for seven years. Although returning to England meant almost certain death, St. Thomas Becket came back. According to historical accounts, King Henry implored, "Who will free me from this troublesome priest!" St. Thomas Becket was later murdered by four knights in his Canterbury Cathedral as he was praying. For his part in the murder, King Henry performed public penance after St. Thomas Becket's canonization.


