



DEACON'S PEN ... a word from the heart of Deacon Joe Whiston



As we turn the page to a new year, both on the secular as well as our liturgical calendars, it should beckon a review of what good we did and perhaps more importantly, what we failed to do. I'm reminded of this when those who beseeched John the Baptist, particularly in the preceding verses to our Gospel reading

today, were being chastised by John as hypocrites for believing that because they were "God's chosen people" under the protection of Abraham, they were exempt from judgment. And as the exempt, there was nothing more that was expected of them; they could live their lives as they saw fit because right or wrong, they were automatically righteous in the eyes of God.

John then shocked them into reality by declaring to them that they were taking a literal understanding of the law and therefore were headed for certain destruction of the soul. John told them that privilege by their heritage alone meant nothing; that life not lineage was God's standard of judgment and because they were His chosen ones, even more was expected of them.

Well, this really got their attention. They had come to be baptized by John which in their minds would seal the deal so to speak. Being baptized would give them the mark on their soul that would then grant them a pass from judgment. "What are we to do?" John began to preach to them about changing their ways; giving to others in need from their own bounty, by being good and fare soldiers and even the tax-collectors came to him and he said, "Exact no more beyond what your instructions lay down."

He was saying that we should share with those in need from our own labors. He laid down the social Gospel that God will never absolve the man who is content to have too much while others have too little.

But he was saying more than this; going beyond sharing by recognizing what Our Lord is calling us to. In other words, be receptive to Our Lord's calling and respond to His vocation for us.

I can relate with my own situation. I was active in my personal spiritual journey and in different roles in the Church. I was content with what I had done in marriage

and family, in business, having received the Sacraments and observing my obligation to attend Mass, and gosh, I was even an Eagle Scout. So, what more could be expected of me. But, in truth, I was being just like the Jews with John the Baptist.

Then suddenly and over a period of about six months, there were those whom I respected for their strong spiritual lives who came to me and said, "You should be a Deacon"; "I think Our Lord is calling you to the Diaconate." Well it was a convenience for me to side step these messages by concluding that I'm not worthy of such a vocation and so I simply sat down until the feeling passed. But the messages persisted until I finally responded.

It's kind of sad that those of my age and older, were raised to believe that "vocations" only applied to those who were called to Holy Orders, a very important pursuit indeed. But in truth, there is a much greater meaning and broader application to the notion of vocations because they come in a vast variety of forms.

There are vocations of teaching, protectors of society and the faith, charity to others, especially those in need, family; working together in a respectable and righteous relationship to each other and being the first heralds of the faith for the children; and these are just a few. One doesn't have to look very far to be both humbled and encouraged by the many works and examples of faith and charity in our own faith community here at St. Charles Borromeo. This space pales in inadequacy to name all of you.

The point John was making then is as it applies now, that we should never be complacent in thinking that there is nothing more to be done. We should never close the doors to what Our Lord may still be calling us to do. Yes, there are practical limits to our capabilities relative to mental, physical or emotional faculties, but we should also know that God doesn't give us anything that we are truly incapable of doing.

So, before we look forward to a new year, we should also look back and take account of where we have traveled and what we may have left undone; always being mindful to recognize what He may still be calling us to do.



Inspiration for the week

Jesus stood in line with everyone else and was baptized. There is something incredibly humbling about how this must have played out. Then, God did something truly awesome and inspiring. Through a very gentle and simple action he let the world know about the special relationship He shares with Jesus. That's exactly what is so incredible about our baptisms as well! Through those holy waters God announces to the world the special place we also occupy in His heart. We no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. We do not need to fumble around, tripping over ourselves and wondering why we are even here. The answer has been given. All we have to do is live out the vocation we have received, to live the Gospel in fidelity to our Creator. There is nothing to fear and worry has no place. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor and God is very pleased.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.
