PASTOR'S PEN ... a word from the heart of Fr. Don Farnan



Arriving in 2022, we give thanks for a marvelous Christmas that came to us like a lamb. Weather so mild, some families enjoyed holiday dinners out-of-doors before the white lion of winter hit us early on New Year's

morning. Our Jesus entered the world among lambs that shepherds in the hills of Bethlehem kept watch over. He is the perfect Lamb of God who was born for sacrifice. When we ponder this tremendous mystery, we realize that we, too, were created to give ourselves to the work of God, to sacrifice and surrender that His will may be done here on earth and reflect, as best we can, the glory of heaven.

In this Jubilee Year of Saint Charles Parish we commemorate seventy-five years of God's grace here on Shady Lane in the northland of Kansas City and hope to make a strong pledge for generations that follow us. Our Diamond Jubilee Capital Campaign started last year with numerous listening sessions to prioritize our capital needs. As a parish, we determined to address the top four items: expansion and renovation of our Borromeo Hall kitchen, enhance our Early Childhood Education Center as it continues to grow, construct a three-stop elevator within our school building, and create much needed storage space for decorations, equipment, and numerous items used for our liturgies, school, grounds, and various groups that use our space to advance our ministry.

The estimated cost of completing these four items is \$1.4million. On commitment Sunday, we received gifts and pledges of \$800,000 (rounded). It is our big hope that many other parishioners will step up so we can raise the

remainder and achieve these four projects during this blessed jubilee year. Once they are completed, we can revisit other ministries that have been put on hold. Among them, is how we can best reach out to our less fortunate neighbors to provide food and other basic needs to help them-whether on our property or at a nearby site. Another area to revisit down the road is beautification and curb appeal. Whether or not we ever create an outreach center by adding onto our Boy Scout building, parishioners want to put some effort into enhancing the loveliness of Mary's Garden by offering a good-looking backdrop for it—perhaps a dedicated space for youth. They, their parents, and our youth workers continuously desire it and such a structure would certainly be a blessing to give them a place to call their own.

Meanwhile, we will continue to look at best usages of our rectory. It might make sense to purchase a small house nearby for a rectory that one (or two) priest(s) could reside in and repurpose the existing rectory for other ministries: faith formation, social outreach, religious education... We are also talking with numerous partners (from The Bishop Sullivan Center to Community America Credit Union) to collaborate on potential offerings we could make within our neighborhood. As you can tell, there are many moving parts for our longterm vision; they will find clarity in time. For now, in this diamond jubilee time, we'll focus on the four small projects that you prioritized. When they are completed, we may be able to see the other (future) projects in new light.

Let's accept the new year with great hope, looking back with gratitude and looking ahead with open hearts and minds. Happy New Year. Let us pray for one another.



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Relationships are hard to clarify. Determining whether people in our lives are simply acquaintances and associates or a deeper level of friend is a journey that takes time. Identifying and celebrating those people who really care about us is a lifelong adventure that involves both moments of intense elation and heartache. Some relationships are more easily definable than others. Two people who are in love must decide whether the love they share has the freedom and depth necessary for lifelong commitments. Other relationships may look like friendship but may harbor grave dysfunction and toxicity. Discernment is needed on all fronts. Our relationship with God also needs definition and discernment. God has taken creation as His spouse and human beings as His children. God delights in us and all that He has made. The wedding feast at Cana demonstrates God's investment in all of this, especially our happiness. Life is a time for celebration and great rejoicing!



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.






