PASTOR'S PEN ... a word from the heart of Fr. Don Farnan



January is filled with many great memorials, events, and celebrations. It begins with the great Solemnity of Mary as Mother of God, followed by the Epiphany and the Baptism of Our Lord. In our nation, it is marked

by the annual tribute to Dr. Martin Luther King and anniversary of Roe v Wade, the Supreme Court decision to legalize abortion almost fifty years ago. These events spark marches for justice and marches for life, beckoning our society to reflect, more lovingly, sacred values and divine virtues.

The final week of the month is dedicated in our American church to Catholic Schools and, from coast to coast, many religious institutes join in the fun of the Super Bowl season by collecting cans of soup to feed the hungry in our society and stock food pantries in our region. In my thinking, all of these events and encounters are connected and intertwined. As Mother Mary gives birth and dedicates her Son in God's temple, we understand her to not only be the bearer of Christ, the anointed, but "Theotokos," the bearer of God. As Joseph protected his wife and son from evil earthly forces imposed by King Herod, we are inspired to reflect upon the value of every human life, beginning with innocent pre-natal life in the womb and the grace given to every mother as bearer of life and first teacher of faith. We, too, then are called to protect the defenseless babies, as well as all who are rejected.

While contemplating Jesus's baptism, we reminisce about our own in which we, too, are made part of God's family of faith. Through baptism, we take on our role and mission just

as Jesus did 2,000 earlier in the Jordan River. Our mission is to announce the Good News by lives of hope. Though we share in original sin and the human condition, we are reminded that God's mercy flows over us like the font of life to wash away our sins, embarrassment, shame, guilt, and pain. As birth is graced with baptism and physical life graced with spiritual life, we know that we have a purpose and goal here on earth. The good news we are called to share is tied to peace and justice, much as Dr. King's legacy proclaims. "Peace" is more than the absence of war/conflict; it is the presence of love/God. "Justice" has little or nothing to do with getting even, as society teaches, but much to do with getting right with God and one another, as sacred scripture teaches. As we pause annually to honor Dr. King, we get strengthened by our Christian, American, and human, mission.

Though it may not seem monumental in the great scheme of things, our collection of soup each year contributes to the overall peace and justice that we preach. It helps us to be more mindful of, and attentive to, those that are, for a plethora of reasons, less fortunate than us. It even ties us to our life purpose and to our baptismal vows.

As we conclude Twelve Days of Christmas with the Epiphany, God's manifestation to the world, we realize we are also commissioned to manifest Him by teaching our children well and passing along the faith. Catholic Schools, originally established in our country by Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton (her feast is January 4th), are another marvelous means to develop and fulfill our ministry and mission. Celebrating our academy and uniting with scholars in a joint effort by contributing soup cans helps us all to honor life and the faith entrusted to us.

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Prophets possess an intimate knowledge of God and act on their experience of God. Prophetic messages usually challenge the status quo and draw us up and out of ourselves, focusing us on the bigger picture. We often think of ourselves and our own needs first. When we listen to someone speak, we judge the merit of the message by its degree of usefulness. If the message or vision contains no personal benefit or profit but a call to stretch and grow, we can become indignant. Prophets are usually the ones whose message challenges us and calls us to see things differently and love more perfectly and deeply. God is love. When listening to St. Paul speak about love we witness the unfolding of this type of unconditional, other centered, self-sacrificial perfect God. It is an invitation to life, freedom, and happiness that can be offered to us only by God. Jesus, who is God and Love incarnate, calls us to this richer expression of love. Are we ready to listen and be challenged and stretched?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

January 2022 Financial Update

The first half of Saint Charles' fiscal year has come to a close, and we are blessed that parishioners continue to contribute to the parish and school's regular operations in addition to generous donations for the capital campaign! Active participation by our parishioners in the weekly offering fuels the growth of our parish and school.

The parish and school brought in \$1.48M of income from July through December, and another generous donation of \$100,000 in stock is being processed. Operating and capital expenditures were incurred of \$1.58M, with the parish and school operating at a small profit for the year to date.




