



PASTOR'S PEN ... a word from the heart of Fr. Don Farnan



As I experience my final Sunday at Saint Charles Borromeo Parish, I look back on much that has happened during recent years. On the worldwide stage, the pandemic of 2020 claimed more than a million American lives

and still lingers, while the Russian invasion of Ukraine continues to rain down terror. Mass shootings and violent massacres devastate our communities coast to coast and moral issues, like abortion, challenge the spiritual fabric of our society. Locally, the Kansas City Chiefs won the Super Bowl on 02-02-2020, a palindrome day—first in over 900 years. Such a winning spirit is certain to continue with great players, coaches, and fans at Arrowhead to cheer it on.

In the Church, Pope Francis commissioned the Synod on Synodality to reawaken us to the grace of the Holy Spirit that dwells among us. Here, in 2017, Saint Charles Elementary, our parish school which served the neighborhood for decades, re-established itself as Borromeo Academy, a classical liberal-arts institute that educates according to tried and true Catholic values and academic methods. And this year, the State of Missouri is issuing full-ride grants to allow schools like ours to substantially increase enrollment.

This year, we arrived at our diamond jubilee, seventy-fifth anniversary, as a parish. The first celebration to commemorate the big event was a "Lighting the Way" Advent gathering last December to begin the liturgical year and kick off a calendar of parties to honor decades of faith in the Kansas City northland. The last six years, in various ways, seem to reflect the last seventy-five with a gamut of joyful and

sorrowful recollections, triumphs and agonies, challenges and opportunities, victories and defeats, obstacles and accomplishments. Though it is always sad to bid farewell to loved ones, it was especially tough this year to say goodbye to school parents, Josh Caylor and Gina Rupnow, who lived at the heart of parish existence and enlivened us by their presence.

These days of transition at the end of June and throughout the summer will be times that point to continued growth and building. As more people join our church and school, we are staying ahead by updating our social halls and community kitchen, enhancing our spaces and programs for children's education, and gaining some much needed storage, while we continue to beautify our facilities. There are lots of indicators that SCB is a parish on the move that is in step with the Gospel message and mission. Though none of us knows how long we will remain part of the community or how long we will be on earth, we are blessed to be in a loving family of faith that journeys with one another from here to eternity. Let us treasure the past in our hearts as we look toward the future with humility, faithfulness, courage, obedience, and great hope.

Please pray for me as I depart to take on my next challenge. Likewise, I will pray for you. It was a blessing for me to get to spend the last six years among you, side-by-side in work and prayer. Together, we accomplished some great feats and surprised some onlookers who did not think it could be done. Thank you for the good times and the grace we shared.

May the road rise to meet you, the wind be always at your back, the sun shine warm upon your face, and the rains fall soft upon your fields, and, until we meet again, may the Good Lord hold you always in the palm of His hand.



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible.
