DEACON'S PEN ... a word from the heart of Deacon Joe Whiston



A funny thing happened on my way to preparing my last bulletin column – I didn't. That is, I had a to-do list, and at the end of the list was my bulletin column, thinking that I had plenty of time – I didn't so I scrambled to get it done and submit it by the next day.

We have all heard the old adage of, "Don't put off until tomorrow that which you can do today." And yet all of us at one time or another have been guilty of this and subsequently have paid the price.

The English writer Denis Mackail tells how when Sir James Barrie was old, he would never make long term arrangements or give invitations for a distant event. "Short notice now!" he would say. One of the most dangerous days in a man's life is when he discovers the word "tomorrow." The passage finishes with the warning that knowledge always brings responsibility. Sin is doubly sinful to the man who knew better; failure is doubly blameworthy in the man who had every chance to do well, but didn't.

There is a part of us that knows that God is always present; but due to distractions and other obligations, well just life, we allow ourselves to get sidetracked and forget for a while what is really important; our primary task. We tend to draw a line between sacred and secular; but if we really know what Christianity means, we will know that there is no part of life when the Lord is away from us, and regardless of the list of things to do, we are all working forever in the great task of Our Lord for us.

I'm not talking about the trivial, more mundane things in life; necessary as they may be but rather discerning the difference of recognizing and having the willingness to know the priorities of our efforts.

The Gospel is about preparing for Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. We may not think that we will be alive when that happens, but we would be wrong. We certainly will, because we will die to this mortal life and our death will be the end to the world that we know and that is when we will meet Christ.

Jesus is saying here that none of us know when that will happen and therefore all the more reason for us to be prepared. And since what we are when we die is what we will be in eternity, nothing is more important than preparing for that most important event in our lives. Like the Jews in Egypt, we are to be ready for our exodus: "Gird your loins and light your lamps."

If that sounds scary and fearful, it shouldn't. Christ begins His sermon today with the words, "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom (Lk 12: 32)." We are His sheep; He is the good shepherd, and He takes care of us. He wants for us just the opposite of fear: fearlessness. It's like the lesson of Zechariah to his son John (the Baptist), "You my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare His way, to give His people the knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins (Lk 1: 76-77)." Do I dare to say that we can be saints too? Yes, at least to strive to be like them to the best of our mortal abilities. We just need first to get beyond ourselves; our day-to-day.

Faith casts our fear. That's why it enables us to do wonderful things, like Abraham and all the saints, as we saw in today's epistle. Read Hebrews 1:1 when you get home today and reflect that you are invited to join this roll call of the saints. This faith, and its fearlessness, is for every one of us. You don't have to be perfect; you just have to believe. Take your eyes off yourself and your worries for a while and just look at Him, as Mary did. That's what prayer most essentially is; just turning our attention to reality, to the most important person in the world – and that's not you or I, that's Him. Just look at Him and see Him looking back at you with infinite wisdom and love. How much love? Just look at the crucifix for the answer.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal was born to a noble family in Dijon, France, on January 28, 1572. Her mother died when she was an infant. Her father raised her and provided for her education. In 1592 She married the Baron de Chantal, the couple were devoted to each other. They had six children, three of whom died in infancy. As Baroness, Saint Jane Frances restored the custom of daily Mass, and was famous for her charitable works. Unfortunately, her husband died in a hunting accident only eight years after their marriage. Devastated Jane Frances was forced to live in her father-in-law's strict household where she took a vow of chastity.

In 1604 while visiting her father in Dijon, she met Saint Francis de Sales and he became her close friend and spiritual director. Although not many of their epistles have survived, the pair had a lively correspondence which lasted until Saint Francis died.

Under the direction of St. Francis de Sales and with his partnership she established the Congregation of the Visitation at Annecy in 1610. This was a unique order, without the extreme ascetical practices typical in other religious orders, accepting women and girls and those rejected by other orders because of poor health or age. The new order was also unusual in its public ministry, rather than a strictly cloistered life. Saint Jane transformed her convent at Annecy into a hospital during the plague of 1628.

The saint died at the Visitation Convent in Moulins on December 13, 1641. At the time of her death, there were 86 convents of Visitation nuns. She was canonized in 1767 by Pope Clement XIII.


