



Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: *And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel.*" Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance.

He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage."

After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was.

They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION DURING THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC


Thanks for support of Community Outreach's Thanksgiving project

CLERGY REFLECTION

The Feast of the Epiphany is the continuation of the mystery of Christmas. In fact, for several centuries the Nativity of our Lord was celebrated on this day; and when, in the year 376, the decree of the Holy See obliged all Churches to celebrate the Nativity on 25th of December, as Rome did, the 6th of January (the actual day of Epiphany) was not robbed of all its ancient glory. It was still to be called the Epiphany, and the Baptism of our Lord Jesus was also commemorated on this same feast, which Tradition has firmly held to be the day on which that Baptism took place. Furthermore, some have claimed the 6th of January to be the actual date of the Miracle of the Wedding Feast of Cana (the year following His Baptism); but the consensus of Tradition holds that the Miracle occurred sixty days after the Baptism, on the 5th of March. Regardless, it became the tradition of the Church to commemorate the Miracle on the 6th of January, though it did not actually occur on that date.

In her wisdom, Holy Mother Church wished to celebrate on the same feast of the Epiphany, or manifestation of Christ, the three miracles by which Christ first made Himself manifest to the world: first, the arrival and adoration of the Magi, manifesting the Divine Kingship of Christ; second, the Baptism, manifesting the Divine Sonship of Christ; and finally, Miracle at Cana, manifesting the Power of Christ, the Divine Bride-groom.

His three-fold magnificence is manifested to us so brightly on this Feast! Let us therefore imitate the faith and obedience of the Magi, before the King of kings; let us adore with the Holy Baptist, the Divine Son, over whom the heavens open; let us take our place at the mystic feast of Cana, beholding the Power of the Divine Bride-groom.
