



LITURGY GUIDE—3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Welcome to the Cathedral of St. Joseph and thank you for joining us for the celebration of Holy Mass today! Please silence your cell phones and refrain from eating, drinking or chewing gum in the Cathedral. Please help keep our Cathedral tidy by utilizing the waste baskets found near the main entrances. Also, please refrain from taking pictures once Mass has begun. You are welcome to take pictures after Mass has concluded.

INTROIT

(At 9:15 & 11AM, the Introit is sung by the choir, followed by the opening hymn.)

Dominus secus mare Galilaeae vidit duos fratres, Petrum et Andream, et vocavit eos: Venite post me: faciam vos fieri piscatores hominum. (Verse) Caeli enarrant gloriam Dei: et opera manuum eius annuntiat firmamentum.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

So Jonah made ready and went to Nineveh, according to the Lord's bidding. Now Nineveh was an enormously large city; it took three days to go through it. 
1 Corinthians 7:29-31

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please Stand

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION DURING THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC

CLERGY REFLECTION

During Advent I started the Advent wreath on fire at 6:45 a.m. Mass. I'm not kidding. It lasted maybe a whole of 5 seconds. I was lighting it as a part of preparation for Mass when I got careless. Thankfully I heard someone call my name through a muffled mask from among the Mass-goers, and saw the strange facial expressions (really, just a bunch of bug-eyed covered faces in the front pews) and the pointing of fingers. Immediately I put it out by slapping at the dry ever-green needles with my hand. That woke me up, believe me. But it got me thinking. Catholic Mutual, our insurance provider, has been suggesting we retire the old votive candles at the Mary and Joseph altars, and move to something more contemporary and safe. I don't want to envision a fire at the Cathedral akin to what happened at Our Lady of Guadalupe church. Catholic Mutual has suggested a new product which is safe and yet elegant. So we are going with it. It's called "St. Killians Candle Burning System." It's the same system that Our Lady of Guadalupe installed following their fire restoration project. People will still be able to light their own individual votive candle as before, but the candle extinguishes itself permanently when finished burning. There is no remnant of the candle left behind. This will also eliminate wax and sand spillage and cleanup, and the endless changing of candles by our custodian and volunteers. It's a "self do-it" system. Two generous parishioners gave me monetary gifts with a note that said, "to use for Cathedral needs at the Rector's discretion." So, "goodbye" to the old, black votive boxes that have been a part of the Cathedral for many years, and "hello" to the new, gold boxes that will fit in so nicely with our Cathedral restoration. We hope to have them installed soon. You may have also noticed the restored Sacred Heart statue now displayed for devotion and veneration at the column near the St. Joseph altar. That statue is original to the Cathedral and stood in different places in the Cathedral church over several years. It's back where it belongs. Once again, generous parishioners (and the Catholic Daughters) contributed to its restoration. It's my mission to have more of the original statues restored and placed in appropriate places throughout the Cathedral building. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus watch over our Cathedral and families; and may Mary and Joseph intercede for all of our needs!
