
1 Corinthians 7:32-35

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please Stand

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. CLERGY REFLECTION

The Swedish-born inventor Alfred Nobel grew up in a family that owned and operated factories which produced explosives and armaments of various kinds used in warfare. Nobel was a brilliant man who went on to invent many important things in his lifetime. Two of his earliest inventions were the blasting cap and dynamite. While these inventions were used for many peaceful purposes they were primarily known for their strategic importance in warfare.

There is a story that tells of the death of Alfred's brother Ludwig. The newspapers incorrectly reported that it was Alfred who had died. In fact one French newspaper's headline for his obituary read "The Merchant of Death is Dead." Upon reading this and other versions of his premature obituary, Alfred realized how the public would perceive him if he died that day. This was not the legacy he desired to leave behind.

Over the next few years he pondered this question and a year before he died he completed his will in which he committed his enormous wealth to establish the Nobel Prize. Since his death, the "Prize" is awarded annually for great achievements in the areas of: Physics, Chemistry, Physiology/Medicine, Literature and Economics. Perhaps the most famous area identified for the award was to an individual making great contributions in the area of World Peace.

Nobel died in 1896 and "the Prize" is what he is most remembered for. This story made me think. How do I want to be remembered when I die? This is a question that deserves some careful reflection. There is another question, however, that requires some prayerful reflection. How do I want God to see me while I am still living? Our responsorial Psalm today is "If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts." Alfred Nobel had the good fortune of seeing where his life legacy was headed. He took it to heart and changed the purpose of his remaining years. Was God communicating with Nobel? It is certainly possible. What is definite is that God does communicate with us in many ways throughout our life. Are we listening? "If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts."
