

CLERGY REFLECTION

Ash Wednesday usually hits me like a ton of bricks. Maybe it's because the season of Lent goes on for an eternity. I think to myself, "Yup, you said you would give up this and this and this...so now it all begins again." Yet, once I get into Lent I can't get enough of it. Prayer becomes heartfelt and personal. Confession becomes surrender and liberation, all in one. Lenten sacrifices purify me in a way nothing else can. How does that Jimmy Buffet song go? "It cleans me out and then I can go on." On Ash Wednesday the Church invites us to enter into a deep human need within us – the need to accept our diminishment and unite ourselves with Christ on the Cross. That's why Ash Wednesday is in truth a day of hope! There is something about Ash Wednesday that says "We all desire to embrace the cross; we are all in this together." This year, due to the COVID virus, the Holy See has declared that ashes are sprinkled on the top of the head rather than imprinted on the forehead by the celebrant's thumb. It's actually a common practice in Europe to sprinkle ashes on top of the head. I remember as a seminarian in Rome attending an Ash Wednesday Mass at Santa Sabina church and having them sprinkled in my hair. It did seem strange not seeing the visible "smudge" on the "melons" around me. We Americans, however, are used to having ashes visible on our forehead. For this reason, with the Bishop's permission, we will offer both options. If you want ashes imprinted on your forehead, you will come up to receive them as usual. If you want them sprinkled on top of your head, we will have you cover your forehead with your hand, to indicate that you prefer not to have your forehead touched. Don't sweat which option you should choose. Either way, it is still a sign that you are entering into the Lent of sacrifice and repentance...the season that "cleans us out and then we can go on."
