Welcome to the Cathedral of St. Joseph and thank you for joining us for the celebration of Holy Mass today! 

In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

CLERGY REFLECTION

1st Sunday of Lent February 21, 2021

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. This is a curious statement. Why would Jesus, who is God, submit himself to temptation? St. John Chrysostom answers this question by noting that everything Christ did and suffered was for our teaching. He began after His baptism to dwell in the wilderness, and fought against the devil, that every baptized person might realize that even after the stain of Original Sin is removed, the inclination to sin remains, causing temptation in many ways. More so, Satan hating the baptized for receiving sanctifying grace and escaping the clutches of hell, becomes even more determined in his tempting of the just. However, enlightened by the example of Christ and strengthened by sanctifying grace, the baptized might not be troubled, as if temptation was something unexpected; but rather might bear up against all things, and persevere as conqueror.

Recognizing that Christ was tempted as are we, we must return to the question of why God permits this

to occur. The Catechism of Trent provides us with a clear and concise answer to this question in its explanation of the line in the Our Father prayer, "And lead us not into temptation". *We are said to be led into temptation by [God] who, although He Himself does not tempt us nor cooperates in tempting us, is said to tempt because He does not prevent us from being tempted [by the Evil One] or from being overcome by temptation when He is able to prevent these things... Temptation has a good purpose, when someone's worth is tried, in order that when it has been tested and proved he may be rewarded and honored, his example proposed to others for imitation... This is the only kind of tempting that can be found in God... In this manner God is said to tempt His own, when He visits them with want, disease, and other sorts of calamities.*

Thus, having received the example of Christ, proposed for our imitation, may we always understand the good purpose of temptation as being the means through which God desires to strengthen us in virtue.


