John 2:13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace."

His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me.*

At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?"

Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up."

The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?"

But he was speaking about the temple of his body.

Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature.

He himself understood it well.

CLERGY REFLECTION

For you will that our self-denial should give you thanks, humble our sinful pride, contribute to the feeding of the poor, and so help us imitate you in your kindness.

These words are from the Preface for Lent III. When I prayed them last Sunday my attention was drawn to the words “feeding the poor.” I thought, how does my self-denials aid in feeding the poor? The images we conjure hearing the words “feeding the poor” can be wide-ranging. Immediately, my mind goes to the homeless person without home or job or stability of life. That category alone is varied. Then, I think of those who just have a difficult time to make ends meet, like paying rent, putting food on the table, clothing their children. Then, there is another category of those who have the necessities, but don’t have the financial capability of furthering their children’s education, or sending them to Catholic school for the good of their values, religion and moral formation. Perhaps they also have a child or children who are mentally/physically delayed or disabled. Reaching out to all these families and individuals is certainly what the Preface has in mind. By our self-denials we become poor in a sense, entering their world in solidarity with them. Yet, if you take the Preface as a whole, the meaning of “feeding the poor” becomes more broad in definition. It becomes figurative. Jesus says, “Blessed are the poor in spirit.” We recognize this “poor in spirit” every February when we initiate Catholic Family Sharing Appeal for the good of our Diocesan and Parish ministries. There is a need to “feed” the soul as well as the body. In a very concrete way, CFSA attempts to accomplish this. Think of how these souls are fed by our giving: Seminarian and Priest education, Evangelization/Discipleship, Catholic Family Services, Pastoral Ministry Services, Communications to the homebound and elderly, Newman Centers on college campuses, various outreach ministries that support sheltering, feeding and healing. I counted up all the ministries under these categories and came up with 54 different ministries for the good of our Diocese and Parish. Please, don’t forget to fill out your CFSA pledge card and get it back to the Parish. Believe it or not, it is Lenten almsgiving. It is “feeding the poor” indirectly but effectively. It is obeying the command of Jesus to look after the least among us...physically and spiritually.
