

## LITURGY GUIDE— Fifth Sunday of Lent

*Welcome to the Cathedral of St. Joseph and thank you for joining us for the celebration of Holy Mass today! Please silence your cell phones and refrain from eating, drinking or chewing gum in the Cathedral. Please help keep our Cathedral tidy by utilizing the waste baskets found near the main entrances. Also, please refrain from taking pictures once Mass has begun. You are welcome to take pictures after Mass has concluded.*

Jeremiah 31:31-34



### GOSPEL

John 12:20-33

Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me.

"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came

from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." The crowd there heard it and said it was thunder; but others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come for my sake but for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." He said this indicating the kind of death he would die.



## CLERGY REFLECTION

---

As you read this I am gone for the weekend. I'm a gathered with my family at my home parish of Holy Cross, Ipswich, where we are dedicating a new set of vestments to the parish in memory of my late father. I will give Fr. Smith your best since I'm staying with him. I can't remember the last time I have been together with all my siblings. Probably my mother's 75th birthday when we gathered here in the Cathedral parish hall (she is now 84 so it's been a long time). My siblings and I will have a lot of stories to tell one another and memories to share – some true, but most embellished. It's amazing how one person's recollection of an event can differ from another's. Yet, reflecting nostalgically can be a healthy experience that helps people find the inspiration and confidence needed to move forward in life, particularly during difficult times. I would go so far as to say that nostalgia is about the future more than the past. Jeremiah had this in mind when he made the prophecy of the "new covenant" that God would establish with His people. The covenant's signature mark is relationship: No longer will we teach our neighbor to "know the Lord," says Jeremiah, we will know Him because He will write the "law upon our hearts." That "law," of course is what we call charity. Wishing the best for someone and even sacrificing so that they might gain it. Jesus will describe charity as a "grain of wheat that falls to the ground." This is what differentiates us from non-believers. "They will know we are Christians by our love," as the old Glory & Praise song goes. It's been edifying to see the prayer intentions that have accompanied our parishioners CFSA pledges. On the pledge card, there is a stub that you can write your intention, and the intention is dispersed to different religious communities in the Diocese for intercessory prayer. The advantage of leaving your prayer card with us (as opposed to mailing it to the Diocese) is that we, your priests, see the intentions and pray for them as well. This is how we "know the Lord," by asking for the needs that are so vital and important to us. As we continue Lent, let's not only remember our own needs, but reach out in prayer for the needs of others as well.
