

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

"Jesus ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father"

Every weekend at Mass we pray the words of the Creed which include, "Jesus ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father." As we celebrate Jesus' Ascension into Heaven today, 40 days after Easter, let us reflect on the words of our Holy Father Pope Francis as he teaches us the importance of Jesus' Ascension. During a General Audience in St. Peter's Square on April 17, 2013 he taught, "Jesus' earthly life culminated with the Ascension, when he passed from this world to the Father and was raised to sit on His right (in Heaven). What does this event mean? How does it affect our life? Let us permit the Evangelist Luke to guide us in this. Let us start from the moment when Jesus decided to make his last pilgrimage to Jerusalem. St Luke notes: "When the days drew near for him to be received up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem" (Lk 9:51). While he was "going up" to the Holy City, where his own "exodus" from this life was to occur, Jesus already saw the destination, heaven, but he knew well that the way which would lead him to the glory of the Father passed through the Cross, through obedience to the divine design of love for mankind. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that: "The lifting up of Jesus on the cross signifies and announces his lifting up by his Ascension into heaven" (n. 662)." These words of our Holy Father are an important reminder that our path to be lifted up to Heaven must also come through the Cross as we choose each day to respond to Jesus' command, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me." As Pope Francis taught, "Jesus already saw the destination, heaven, but he knew well that the way which would lead him to the glory of the Father passed through the Cross, through obedience to the divine design of love for mankind." Choosing daily that our desired destination is Heaven affects all of the decisions we make. Let us ask Jesus for the grace this week to choose daily to take up the Cross as our compass on our destiny to Heaven. By learning to surrender through acts of denying ourselves and choosing "obedience to the divine design of Love" we will follow the path of Jesus in which He will lead us to Heaven.

May this prayer of Blessed Charles de Foucauld help you in your daily surrender:

Father, I abandon myself into your hands; do with me what you will. Whatever you may do, I thank you: I am ready for all, I accept all.

Let only your will be done in me, and in all your creatures — I wish no more than this, O Lord.

Into your hands I commend my soul: I offer it to you with all the love of my heart, for I love you, Lord, and so need to give myself, to surrender myself into your hands without reserve, and with boundless confidence, for you are my Father!
