He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.



CLERGY REFLECTION

Summer is supposed to be a time of vacations, rest and relaxation, a time to slow down and “smell the roses.” That has not necessarily been the case here at the Cathedral, nor do I suspect it has been the case any where else, including with family life. Coming off a year and a half of suspension and isolation, we have three years of activity now colliding into one. Getting back to normal again has come with a cost: busyness. I just counted the weddings we will have at the Cathedral this year - 46. Now, don't get me wrong all of this is good, but the extra chaos can tax one's health and equilibrium. This year is “not” normal because of the expanded activity. The more we can remind ourselves of this fact, the more we can be at peace with whatever comes our way. This is why St. Paul's Second Reading for today is perfect for the occasion: “We walk by faith and not by sight.” Yes we do. Especially now. I have to remind myself of this truth every day...and so should you my Cathedral family. “We walk by faith...” Jesus says in the Gospel for this Sunday that the mustard seed had plenty of activity once it blossomed into a leafy bush. The Cathedral is indeed that leafy bush. And like the leafy bush, there is plenty that goes on underneath its leafy branches that no one sees. Like those “behind the scenes” volunteer jobs at the Cathedral. We seem to be scrambling for help on different fronts: Homebound parishioners without transportation to church want to get back to Mass again; but we need bus drivers. Our Social Concerns Committee wants to serve the needy of our parish and city once again; but they need volunteers. The ushers have been heroic ushering at the Sunday liturgies before and after Covid; but they could use some bolstering within their ranks. Liturgical ministers have stepped up when called upon; but this is the perfect time for the next generation of parishioners to carry on the torch of lectoring and helping with Holy Communion at Mass. Consider it, please. Pray about it, please. Let's navigate through this “abnormal-normal” year by faith ... and lots of investment!
