



Like them, the meek and lowly, on high may dwell with thee.


PENITENTIAL ACT

Can you sleep in a storm?

As you know summer thunderstorms happen frequently in South Dakota. Do you sleep through them or do they keep you awake? In today's Gospel Jesus is in a boat, in the midst of a storm, sleeping. What? How is that possible? The waves are crashing into the boat, the apostles are afraid of sinking and "... they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" How can He be sleeping while they are afraid of perishing? Take a moment to reflect and we can conclude from the standpoint of self-preservation that if the storm was going to destroy the apostles Jesus Himself would also perish. He will not allow that to happen to them or to Himself. "He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" Jesus is calling the apostles as well as you and me to a deepening of faith during the trials and "storms" of our life. At our Baptism God gave us the gift of faith. This gift is with us throughout our entire lives. It is a daily decision whether we will live out of that gift, putting it into practice or let it lie dormant. I believe that God allows trials and storms to help us put our faith into practice. Trials and storms happen to me frequently. Here is one recent experience I want to share with you. In the past month I have been driving back and forth between Sioux Falls and the Broom Tree retreat center in Irene helping with a retreat. Arriving just in time for my 1:30 meeting, I got out of my truck and noticed my tire was nearly flat. I thought to myself: I have three hours to get this fixed before I need to be back on the road to Sioux Falls to arrive for my 5:30 appointment. I prayed a short prayer asking Jesus for help and went to my appointment. When I had finished my first appointment and was about to send a text message to ask the maintenance man from the retreat center for help another staff member came up to me and said that the maintenance man had seen my tire and was now working to get it fixed. By the time I was ready to leave at 4:30 the truck was ready to go and there was no delay in me getting to my 5:30 appointment. God provides. A "storm" came up, Jesus helped me turn my need to Him and He provided through His human instrument and servant the maintenance man of Broom Tree. Amazing grace. How good He is to us. Please join me in praying for a deepening of faith as we pray the prayer the angel taught to the 3 children of Fatima:

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You! I ask pardon of You for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love You.

To grow deeper in living out this gift and virtue of faith I recommend for your summer reading a book published by Sophia Institute Press entitled, When Jesus Sleeps: Finding Spiritual Peace Amid the Storms of Life by Luis María Martínez.
