



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CLERGY REFLECTION

Will You Fight for Me?

Having celebrated Memorial Day at the end of May and the 4th of July this past week we remember the many men and women who have fought physical battles for us to be free citizens in our country. I'm grateful for their sacrifices. In today's Gospel Jesus teaches us about a different kind of battle that all of us are involved in. He "gave them (the Apostles) authority over unclean spirits...So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them." There is a spiritual battle against unclean spirits and demons that are threatening our religious freedoms here in the U.S. and abroad. This past week, as we do every year on the Catholic Church's calendar of July 6th, we celebrated the life and feast day of Saint Maria Goretti. St. Maria Goretti's life teaches us the importance of fighting for the protection of our souls and for our eternal salvation. If you don't know Maria's story I encourage you to look into it for your own encouragement and spiritual growth. Maria was born and raised in a Catholic family in Italy. At a young age already she knew and lived her

most important relationship was her relationship with God. She was taught and learned daily the importance of choosing Jesus first. As an 11 year old girl she once again made the decision to keep Jesus first even when being threatened by the neighbor boy Alessandro who made sexual advances to her. When she refused to submit to him, he stabbed her fourteen times. She fought against him not primarily because she wanted to save her physical life from his attack, but because she wanted to protect her purity and didn't want Alessandro to sin by being impure with her. She was taken to the hospital and in the process of dying she forgave Alessandro. "He was arrested, convicted, and jailed. During imprisonment, he repented. After 27 years he was released from prison and visited Maria's mother to beg for forgiveness, which she granted. He later became a lay brother in a monastery, dying in 1970. Maria became a canonized saint in 1950." As we hear this story of St. Maria Goretti's battle for her purity and perseverance in her faith amidst the threats against her, I propose to you 4 ways to help you engage in the spiritual battle that takes place in your life on a daily basis.

CLERGY REFLECTION

Prayer — daily prayer is absolutely necessary to grow in faith and to resist the temptations and snares of the unclean spirits that Jesus speaks of in the Gospel. Jesus, please give me the grace to pray today. Here is a form of prayer that we see Jesus use during His agony in the garden.

Acknowledge – thoughts, feelings and desires. Anger, frustration, anxiety, etc. that you are feeling; acknowledge it is real. Relate – Tell the Lord all about whatever is bothering you. This step of relating gets it off your chest and places it in the hands of the Lord.

Receive - Ask Him for His grace, His guidance as to what to do with the struggle you are having, what direction to go to find freedom, how to let go. Pray the grace: "Jesus, I give You permission to love me."

Respond – Only once you have received the grace or the direction the Lord wants you to go can you respond and take the necessary steps forward to freedom.

Sacraments — each of the Sacraments offer us God's invitation to experience His presence with us and His assistance to choose Him above all so as to strengthen us in the spiritual battle.

Participating weekly in Mass & preparing and receiving in the proper state of grace Jesus in Holy Communion Receiving the Sacrament of Confession when you have committed a mortal sin that breaks your relationship with God I also recommend monthly Confession of venial sins that weaken your relationship with God. This practice is a form of preventive medicine in your relationship with God so that venial sins become uprooted and don't worsen to become mortal sins that pull you apart from God.

Fellowship — we need friends, family members, fellow parishioners that are our support system who help us grow in faith, pray for us and help us learn how to continue against the daily battles of sin and temptation that threaten us. Let us learn from each other and ask each other for help.

Service — giving of ourselves in service to others is a way of putting our faith into action as well as a step to overcome physical and spiritual sloth/laziness. Learning to live the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy orients our hearts toward God and love of neighbor leaving very little room for Satan to get into our lives. "Idle hands are the devil's workshop."

Corporal Works of Mercy

To feed the hungry. To give water to the thirsty. To clothe the naked. To shelter the homeless. To visit the sick. To bury the dead. To visit the imprisoned, or ransom the captive.

Spiritual Works of Mercy

To instruct the ignorant. To counsel the doubtful. To admonish the sinners. To forgive offenses.

To comfort the afflicted. To pray for the living and the dead. To bear patiently those who wrong us.

Let us daily make the decision, by God's grace, to fight for our relationship with Jesus, protecting our own relationship with Him and helping others keep their relationship with God first also.
