

CLERGY REFLECTION

Many things at the Cathedral inspire me, but one of the characteristics about our Cathedral that inspires me most is our universality.

Visitor or parishioner attending Mass on any given Sunday can look around the pews and take note of this fact. One might even think that they were standing in St. Peter's in Rome rather than in the St. Joseph's in Sioux Falls. We reflect the mixture of demographics, cultures and ethnic groups that makes the Church truly "universal."

As we enter the post-Covid period and Mass attendance continues to increase, it becomes more apparent that this is the role of a Cathedral parish: To be a place of worship for all Catholics (and even non-Catholics) who wish to call this sacred space their home.

I am inspired by the dedication of our older parishioners whose volunteerism and commitment have made the Cathedral parish what it is today, one of firm foundation and stability. I am inspired by our younger families whose energy and enthusiasm keeps the Cathedral parish vibrant and alive. We don't have the amenities that suburban parishes have when it comes to catering to children, yet our young families remain faithful because of their love for the Mass and their desire to give their children a sense of the sacred. It never disturbs me (or any priest as far as I know) to hear the sound of children at Mass. Young parents seem to know when it's time to "get up and move around" to calm them down. Yet, hearing the sound of children's voices at Mass is proof that we are growing ... and we need that growth, that vitality!

Lastly, we are blessed to have the different ethnic cultures that inhabit our parish community. They enlarge our world beyond the confines of South Dakota, and elucidate our understanding of people's plights much larger than our own. We read in the Gospel this Sunday, that people came to Jesus in great numbers. May they continue to come to the Shepherd of Peace in great numbers in our present day ... especially at our Cathedral parish.
