




PENITENTIAL ACT

GOSPEL

John 6:1-15

Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please Stand

CLERGY REFLECTION

What is your call in life? Some of you might feel that you have missed your calling. Others may still be trying to figure out what their calling is. One of the criteria for determining if you are following your call is to first understand what that is. In this Sunday's second reading, St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians urges us, "to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received." The call St. Paul is referring to has little to do with following a certain career path, pursuing an education or degrees or even using your gifts and talents to achieve your life goals. Rather the call that Paul is urging the Ephesians to live, and us as well, is the call to become Christ-like or in other words to live the life of a Christian. This is a higher calling than anything that the world can offer. One that has eternal rewards.

Paul does not leave us wanting in how we can be successful at living out our call. He gives us the attributes of living a life in imitation of Christ. At the top of his list are humility and gentleness, followed closely by patience and finally bearing with one another through love. The ironic first step in living out our call is to give up control of our destiny. To humble ourselves and allow Jesus to be sovereign in our lives means to surrender to His Holy Will and follow it with a gentle spirit. Another important step is to show unconditional love for our neighbor especially those who easily disrupt our peace. Remember Paul also says that we should be striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace. If you're like me there are days when I follow my call better than others.

Living in a manner worthy of our call can seem overwhelming at times especially when pain, suffering, hardship and even lack of hope confronts us. For many months Julie and I have ministered to an inmate in the county jail that has been charged with a crime that could cause him to face the death penalty if found guilty. In addition, he has lost everything he possessed including custody of his children. The last conversation we had with him he stated that he was at more peace than he has ever been in his entire life. Not only is he at peace with who he is in relation to Christ but he spends his time teaching and ministering to others in the cell block about how they too can have a relationship with Jesus. He received the sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time in many years and we now bring him Holy Eucharist weekly. Despite his circumstances of being incarcerated, we witness this young man truly living out his call.

I would encourage you to take some time this week and reflect on whether you are living your life as St. Paul suggests, "in a manner worthy of the call you have received."
