
PENITENTIAL ACT

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING


Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, “Would that we had died at the LORD’s hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!” Then the LORD said to Moses, “I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not. I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the Lord, am your God.” In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, “What is this?” for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them, “This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat.”

Faith is a Daily Work

Choosing to believe in Jesus Christ is a daily choice. In today’s Gospel “they said to Jesus, “What can we do to accomplish the works of God?” Jesus answered and said to them, “This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent.” We make all sorts of daily decisions and do all types of daily work. Did you consider that choosing to have faith is part of your daily work and decisions? In the midst of busyness it is easy to lose focus and a temptation to forget about Jesus and our daily need for Him. This week let us be intentional in choosing to daily grow in faith in Jesus. Today as you read this He is giving you your first opportunity of this new week to choose faith in Him as we hear Him teach us, “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst.” Do you believe He is the bread of your life that can satisfy your hunger and quench your thirst? I have seen and experienced Jesus come into the hunger and thirst deep in my heart and soul in ways that no one else or nothing else can. He is giving us an important reminder and a history lesson: “Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: *He gave them bread from heaven to eat.*” So Jesus said to them, “Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.” It is an act of faith in our Heavenly Father that He has sent us His Son and continues to send us His Son as our food from heaven. Not only does our Father desire to feed us He feeds and gives life to the entire world. Doubting and distrusting our Heavenly Father and the gift of His Son Jesus Christ is not how we have been taught. “That is not how you learned Christ, assuming that you have heard of him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus”.
