### FIRST READING


1 Kings 19:4-8

## CLERGY REFLECTION

You have a guest writer for your bulletin article this week! For anyone that I haven't had the good fortune to meet, my name is Fr. Andy Thuringer. My main assignment is as the chaplain of Bishop O'Gorman Catholic High School, but I've also been blessed over the last year to celebrate the sacraments here at the Cathedral. The word Church (ecclesia) means a gathering and I feel so blessed to be surrounded by this gathering every Sunday.

Still, with each passing Sunday I realize we are getting closer and closer to the end of summer. With a new school year starting up, I asked for this opportunity to let you know some of the exciting things that are happening at O'Gorman. I think it's important to note that our Bishop has a great deal of love and zeal for Catholic education. It's been decades since O'Gorman has had a full-time chaplain and I feel humbled and honored to revive the tradition of having priests teaching in the classroom. Especially in a priest shortage, I think this speaks volumes about our Bishop's care for the young people of our diocese.

However, I won't be the only religious in the halls of O'G. We are pleased to welcome two sisters from Pro Ecclesia Sancta (PES), Sr. Eileen and Sr. Lynn. These two joyful women will be ministering at O'Gorman full time using their gifts and talents to help our students grow in holiness through God's love. PES has also sent two priests to serve in Mitchell and will soon be starting a house of formation for their seminarians across the street from O'Gorman. I hope you get a chance to meet Sr. Eileen and Sr. Lynn. They are truly ambassadors of God's love.

Finally, if you have children, I'd just ask you to prayerfully consider sending them to Catholic schools. With each passing year we see our society drifting further from Christ and the need for a place where young people can learn and grow in their faith increases. Our Bishop and all of the faculty and staff at O'Gorman are striving to make our schools just such a place. And a big thank you to each and every person that makes our Catholic schools possible.
