


Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8

**GOSPEL**

Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. — So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?” He responded, “Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: *This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts.* You disregard God’s commandment but cling to human tradition.”

He summoned the crowd again and said to them, “Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. “From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile.”

**PROFESSION OF FAITH**

*Please Stand*

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. ## CLERGY REFLECTION

---

On a business trip to Washington, D.C. years ago I found myself with a chunk of free time and decided to use that gift to walk through the National Gallery of Art. As I was walking past one room I noticed one smaller painting on a pillar and one chair placed in front of it. The painting was well lit and I was drawn into the room to see what it was and who the artist was. To my astonishment and delight I discovered it was an original painting by Leonardo da Vinci! I sat down in front of that painting and just gazed on it in awe for at least fifteen minutes. I still remember it as though it was yesterday.

While most people don't often get an opportunity to sit alone before such a man-made wonder and gaze at it without interruption, we have something infinitely more awesome we can gaze upon any time we would like. Jesus Christ residing in the tabernacle of every Catholic Church.

I have frequently asked myself how often do I sit before the tabernacle (or even just pass in front of it) with a sense of wonder and awe that Jesus is present and ready to give his full attention to all who come to Him? How often do any of us experience those emotions at such times?

It is easy to take even the presence of Jesus for granted because he is always there for us. We don't even have to leave Sioux Falls to sit before Jesus every day and we can even become one with him every day by receiving his precious Body and Blood at daily Mass. Let us try to always be aware of these moments with wonder and awe.

Now there is another point that has occurred to me recently as a result of that time before the Davinci painting. Each one of us is made in the image and likeness of God. If we take some time to reflect on that reality, I mean really reflect on it, we should not be able to look at any other human being without a sense of wonder as well.

The next time we feel anything other than love for a person we encounter in our daily lives, let us remind ourselves who they are, and who we are, and thank God for the gift of being His children and for the love He has for each of us.
