

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please Stand



I NEED YOUR HELP

It’s me. As I read through the readings this week preparing to write this article and to preach on the readings I realized I am the spiritually blind, mute, and deaf person that was described in the readings. Therefore, I need your help. As Isaiah teaches us, “Thus says the LORD: **Say to those whose hearts are frightened:** Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you.” I face fears daily and by God’s grace and your words of encouragement I am able to overcome these fears in my daily life. I believe I can also help encourage you by my words and prayers. Notice how many times during the Mass that we pray for one another, “The Lord be with you. And with your spirit.” We are praying for each other throughout the Mass that we may experience the Lord. In our world and nation division runs deep. Let us humbly acknowledge our need for God who works through us to encourage and help each other. Through the prophet Isaiah God teaches us, “**Then** will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; **then** will the lame leap like a stag, **then** the tongue of the mute will sing. Streams will burst forth in the desert, and rivers in the steppe. The burning sands will become pools, and the thirsty ground, springs of water.” After we encourage each other with God’s words and pray for one another **then** we can see more clearly, hear more deeply and have a new spiritual strength to run the race of faith throughout our lives. None of us are exempt from a need for God and for one another. All of us are poor because of our sin as St. Paul teaches us. “Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. **Did not God choose those who are poor in the world** to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?” The next time someone comes into the Cathedral that looks differently than you or seems to be physically poorer in economic means let us remember St. Paul’s words, “My brothers and sisters, show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. For if a man with gold rings and fine clothes comes into your assembly, and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes and say, “Sit here, please,” while you say to the poor one, “Stand there, ” or “Sit at my feet, ” have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs?” We pray for and encourage one another no matter what we look like or no matter how much money we have or don’t have in our bank account. In today’s Gospel it was a group of people, friends, who brought to Jesus the deaf man who had a speech impediment, “**And people brought to him** a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him.” When Jesus teaches us to pray He teaches us to call God **our** Father. He teaches us to ask for **our** daily bread. He teaches **us** to ask forgiveness for **our** sins and the sins of those have sinned against **us**. Let us join together in praying for one another and encouraging one another as a small step of grow in faith to persevere through the challenges we are **ALL** facing.

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name;
Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.
