GOSPEL

Mark 8:27-35

Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him. He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."





CLERGY REFLECTION

One of the many shining lights of our Cathedral Parish is the Social Concerns Committee (SCC). This group spearheads the outreach activities that aid those who are less fortunate – within our parish and outside our parish. The SCC team organizes the parish's contribution/volunteerism for serving at the Banquet located downtown. They coordinate the efforts that help children and families outside our little geographical bubble – like the socks and gloves drive for Native American families living on reservations – as well as for providing the opportunity for our parishioners to help with shoes for school children that are in need closer to home, through the "Shoes for Children" fund. When Bishop Swain instituted "Phase II" of the "Beacon of Hope" vision – the restoration of the Cathedral for the beauty of art and architecture – he knew that the next phase of that vision (Phase III) was imperative for outreach to the poor. Thus, the creation, design and construction of the Bishop Dudley House and Emergency Shelter, which has aided hundreds if not thousands of homeless people since its completion in 2015. Having a beautiful Cathedral for prayer and liturgy is not in opposition to helping the poor. Everyone should be able to worship in the same beautiful space regardless of one's economic status. Possessing and enjoying beauty is written on the human heart. Jesus makes an interesting comment when a woman, out of sheer admiration, pours an expensive jar of "costly perfume" over his head while reclining at Simon's house (Mat. 26:6-11). He tells his followers (who are indignant about what they perceive as waste) that "the poor you will always have with you." James, in our Second Reading this Sunday, tempers Jesus' extravagance by telling us that faith without good works is dead. "If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well,' but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." Faith and good works go hand in hand; as much as a beautiful Cathedral and helping the least of our brothers and sisters go hand in hand. A big shout out to the Social Concerns Committee, and to all parishioners who respond to their ministry, for their "faith and good works."
