

### Litany of the Childlike

From resentment of my brothers' achievements and gifts ... From finding my worth in externals ... From the doubt that You really care about me ... From the lie that I have to earn Your love ... From the lie that I am a burden or an inconvenience ... From the lie that I should just try harder ... From the lie that I am not enough ... From the lie that Your grace is not enough ... From the lie that You want only my strengths and not my weaknesses ... From the lie that I have to stop sinning before I can approach You ... From the lie that I am alone ... From the lie that I am the only one with these struggles ... From the temptation to give up ... *Deliver me, Jesus.*

*Jesus, grant me ...* Trust in Your Father's providential care for me. ... Trust in Your desire and ability to heal me. ... Trust that the Holy Spirit is constantly guiding me. ... Simplicity of heart. ... Tranquility, confidence, and the peace that only You can give. ... A heart full of gratitude. ... The conviction that success in life depends more on You than it does on me. ... The conviction that my worth comes from being the Father's son and not from what I do. ... The conviction that Your grace is enough. ... The conviction that Your power is made perfect in my weakness. ... The conviction that I am known and I am loved. ... The conviction that You are healing my memories, passions, and desires. ... The conviction that You have a plan that is just for me. ... The conviction that You delight in me. ...
